

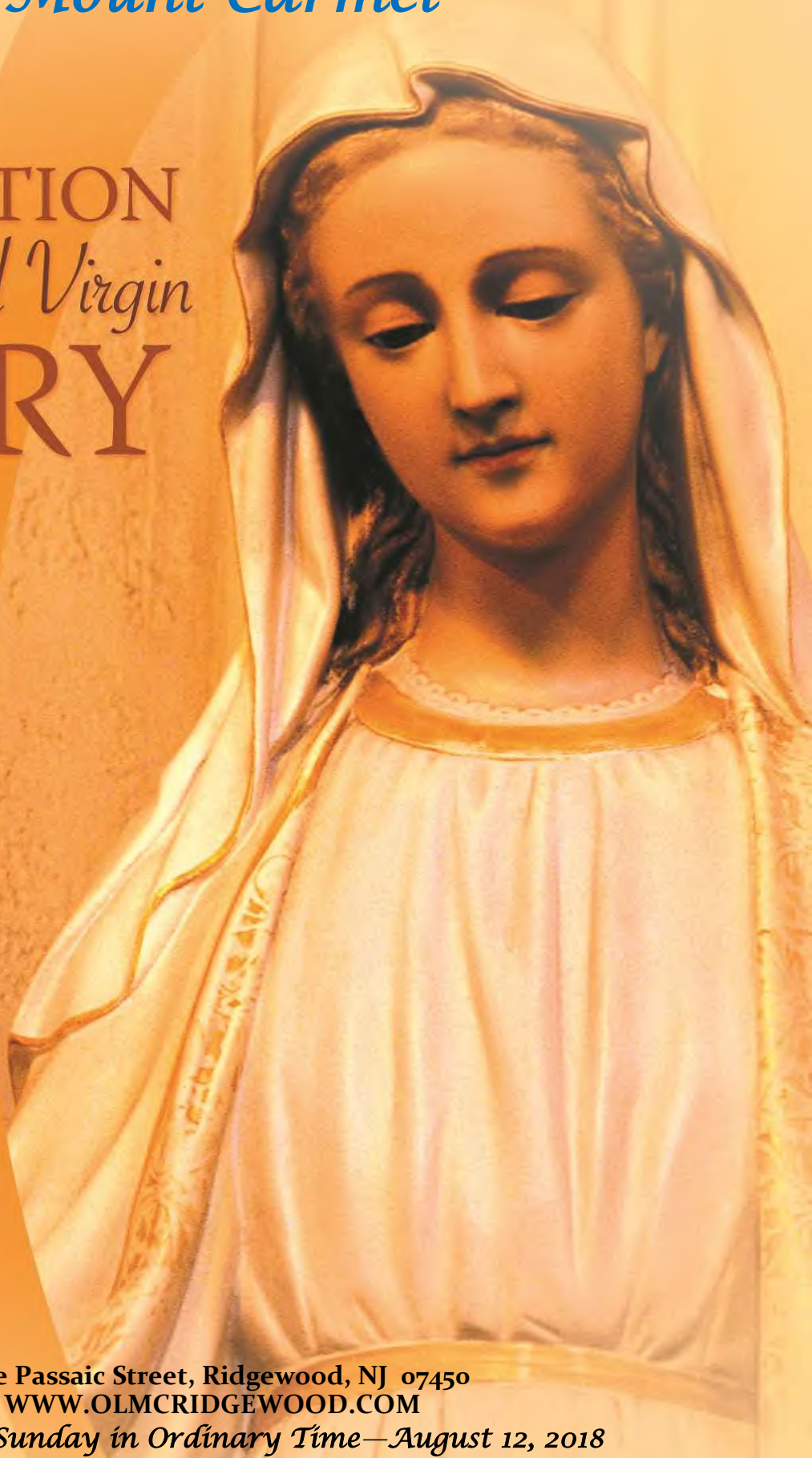

TODAY'S READINGS

- 1 Kings 19:4-8**
 As Elijah's story is picked up in this excerpted reading, the prophet's journey into the desert has begun as an escape from Queen Jezebel who seeks to put him to death, a death he prays for, but not at her hands. However, Elijah is to find out, once again, that when human resources seem useless and human hopes fail, God's power can provide unexpected strength so that the divine plan will proceed. Being fed by God, Elijah was assured that God saw and protected him on every step of his way.
- Ephesians 4:30 - 5:2**
 Seals served to identify their owner. The gift of one's seal to another also signified the conferral of authority, and it served to conclude legal documents. The sealing with the Holy Spirit served to identify the believer as one who belongs to God and is bound to God, and it confers graces that endow each believer with a share in the very power of Christ, thus making them responsible for living lives that are responsive to and reflective of that gift. Sealed by the Spirit, all we are and do, all we say and think becomes a gift to God, united, as it were, with the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.
- John 6:41-51**
 Once again, Jesus references the manna in the desert to make his point with the crowd. Their ancestors ate manna in the desert; it was their food for the journey. The bread Jesus gives, Himself, is also food for the journey. But the bread that Jesus gives, Himself, is not only for this journey, it is also food for the journey to eternal life, a food which the manna could never be. With this bread of His very Flesh, Jesus invites the hearer to feed on Him, to share His life, that he/she may find eternal life. Gifted with this bread, it will be up to the hearer to murmur (as the crowd has already been doing) or to believe.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

- Like Elijah, we all have moments of despair, a faith crisis. In such moments, how did you find God? How did God find you?
- Paul tells us to remove all bitterness, fury, anger, revilement, shouting and malice. What situations spur these feelings in you? What steps can you take to remember Jesus in these moments?
- If the bread of life is Jesus' flesh, food for the journey to eternal life, why do you think so many Catholics today believe "praying at home" is just as good? What do you believe?
