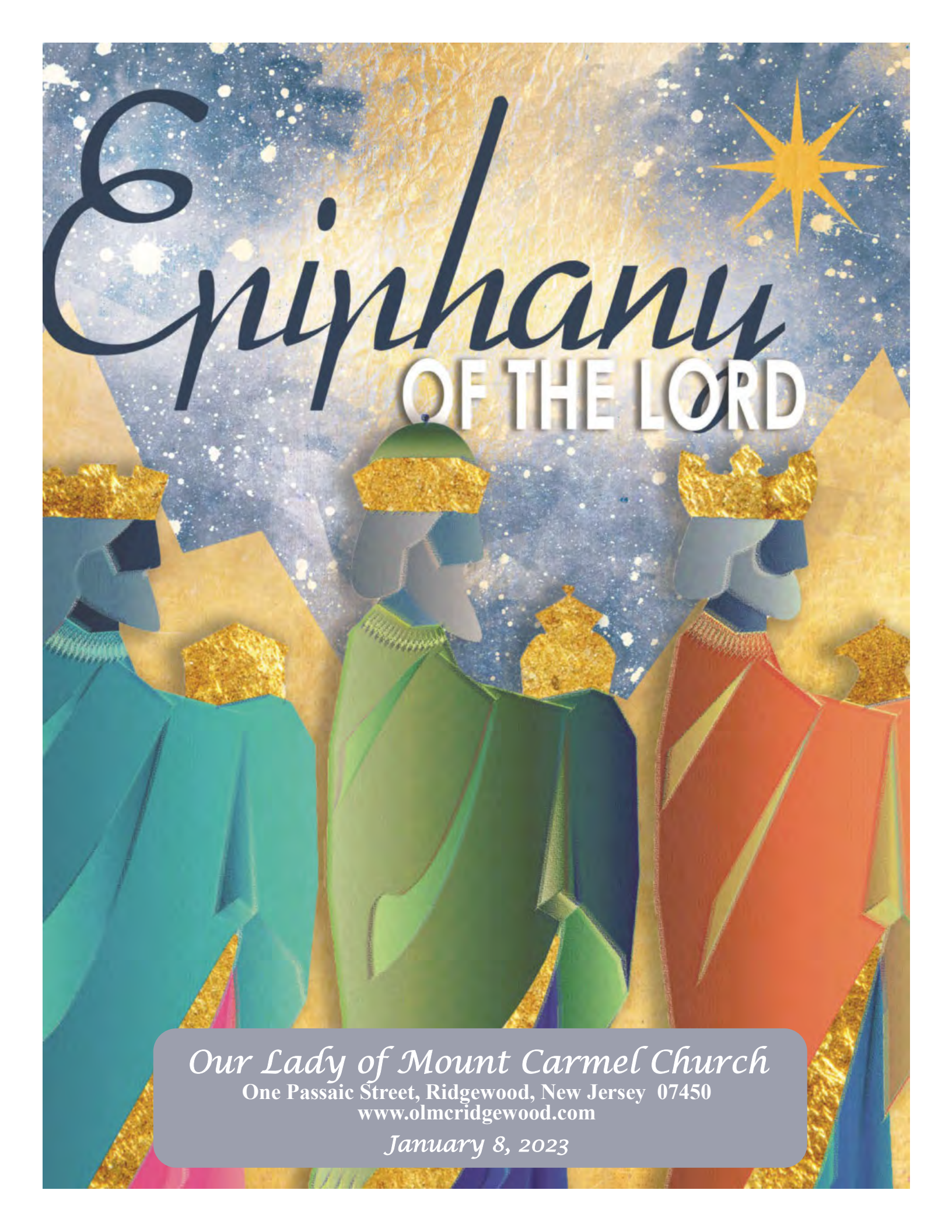

Dear Friends,

Over the course of the last couple of weeks I have mentioned several times that when the Advent Season is as long as it can be, then the Christmas season is as short as it can be. We have seen that this year, when there were no Sundays between Christmas and January 1 and between January 1 and the celebration of the Epiphany which is this weekend. So, the liturgical Christmas season ends tomorrow, Monday, Jan. 9th, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

I had mentioned last week that a number of people spoke to me about the Christmas message I sent by phone to all our parish households. If I may, I want to repeat some of it now. I said that I was...

“calling to wish you, joy, peace and blessings for the great feast of Christmas that we’re about to celebrate. Especially in this season we all long for lives touched by love. We want to believe that truth and goodness will triumph over adversity and arrogance. We want to believe that the spirit of giving takes hold of our hearts and has the power to bring warmth where there is coldness, love where there is indifference and peace where there is discord.

“All of these sentiments have one origin—in the heart of the God who loves us so much He came to walk with us in this journey of hope, to make them real, in the flesh of Jesus Christ, who’s birth we celebrate.

“Darkness is banished, light and warmth have returned and God is waiting to embrace you with his love. To imagine this, as Christmas begins, is to open your life to the Divine Mystery that can fill your heart. Merry Christmas to you and to all those you love.”

I have omitted from the text the specific invitation to the mass times for obvious reasons. Theologically, Easter may be at the heart of our faith, believing in the Resurrection of Jesus as God’s promise for our own passage into eternal life. But Christmas is the promise that Jesus walks with us in our journey through this life, the assurance that the “enfleshed” God understands us, our joys and sorrows, our struggles and our accomplishments, our aspirations and hopes and our fears. It is the fact that we are touched by the divine that makes Christmas the universally accepted moment of hope (the shining star) in the darkness of our world.

Then it all comes to an end, when the lights go out and the trees and decorations come down, sometimes the day after Christmas, or the day after New Year’s, or whenever. But it doesn’t have to be. Christ can be close to us throughout the whole year. But it takes effort. Imagine Christmas without any decorations, no trees, no lights—nothing. It takes physical effort to change our environment to raise our spirits. So it is in the post-Christmas world. It takes effort, celebrating Eucharist, deepening prayer, joining community

(the same way we join with family and friends during the “holidays”). God will not magically keep our hearts focused on him, and the warmth He brings to our lives. We need to create that environment ourselves. Our parish goal is, and has always been, to help each and every one of us, in whatever way we can, to feel closer to Christ, to encounter Him in our daily lives and through this encounter to know how much we are loved by this God of ours.

There are two opportunities coming up that can help you do this, two ways in which you can create an environment in which to feel the presence of Christ in a deeper way. The first begins this Thursday evening and it is called ChristLife/Discovering Christ which you have already heard so much about. The second opportunity, for the men of the parish, is the Men’s Cornerstone Retreat about which you will be hearing this weekend. I invite you to listen carefully to the brief presentations at each mass and then listen carefully to your heart and if you desire to create an environment in which Christ can continue to touch you, take a brochure with you and register. You won’t regret it.

STEWARDSHIP

“Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.” In this familiar Gospel, the three wise men offer gifts to the Lord. The Christian Steward also offers gifts to the Lord, gifts of his/her **Time, Talent and Treasure**, because God has first shared His greatest gift, Jesus the Christ, with them. What gifts do you give to God, in appreciation of this great Gift, and many other blessings besides?

The parish Stewardship of Treasure for the in-pew collection last Sunday was \$17,588. Because so many of the weeks of December were not reported because of early bulletin deadlines, the Stewardship of Treasure for the in-pew collections for all four Sundays of December are listed below, as is the usual summary for the month of December.

12/4	\$14,861	12/18	\$14,211
12/11	\$16,153	12/25	\$130,285

The parish Stewardship of Treasure for the 4 Sundays of December was \$228,282. It was received as follows:

WeShare Online Giving,	\$52,772
In Pew/Received at the Rectory:	\$175,510

This includes the fourth Sunday of the month which was Christmas Day.

As a point of comparison, church support for the 4 Sundays of December, 2021, was \$111,685, and for the 4 Sundays of December 2020, it was \$96,907 and the 4 Sundays of 2019 (pre-pandemic) it was \$125,608. Those figures do not include the Christmas collection because it was not a Sunday. This year’s figures do include the Christmas collection so far. A final figure will be given at the end of January.

1. Isaiah 60:1-6

The closing oracles of Isaiah celebrate the restoration of Jerusalem. Newly reconciled with God and recently returned from the darkness of exile in Babylon, the people, represented as Jerusalem, are invited to rise from their feet and witness all the wonderful things God has in store for them. The darkness and thick clouds of the people's past are replaced by light. And the nation itself becomes that for the nations, guiding them along the path that leads to God. In thanksgiving for this priceless lesson in faith that Jerusalem offers them, the nations bring great riches to the holy city.

2. Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6

As a steward, Paul understands that all that God has revealed to him was to be passed on to others. Essential to this mission is the realization of the universality of God's loving and saving concerns for all humankind. Though the universal character of God's plan was envisioned and encouraged by the prophets (as in Isaiah in the 1st reading), the provincialism that narrowed the vision was a major barrier for the Chosen People. Now, however, God has made it clear that all enjoy the Promise.

3. Matthew 2:1-12

The Matthean theme of Jesus' rejection by Israel, but acceptance by the gentile world is prefigured in this infancy narrative. Not only do the gifts portend Jesus' kingship (gold), his priestly ministry (frankincense) and his sacrificial death (myrrh), they prefigure the announcement and acceptance of the message of universal salvation by the gentiles, over and above its acceptance by the Chosen People. While the kings represent this gentile world, Herod, the priests and scribes and all Jerusalem represent those Jews, considerable in number, who will reject Jesus. It is a clash of kingdoms, but the Kingdom of God will triumph.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Have you ever been moved to action by a star, a vision, an inner voice? When?
2. To whom would you go a great distance to see (e.g. a rock star, a political leader, a religious leader)? Why?
3. Matthew's story of the Epiphany is about the message that is now open and available to "outsiders." Whom do you treat as outsiders? Does this Gospel say anything to you about that?

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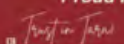


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
