Other times by pre-arranged appt. with a priest. Communal Penance celebrations (with individual confessions) are celebrated in Advent and Lent and will be announced.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who wish to enter the Catholic faith and Catholics who wish to complete the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are most welcome to begin the journey at any time. Call the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

Dear Friends,

When I was in the Seminary back in the 60's (1960's that is) we used to call this time of year a *Darlington February*. The formal name was Immaculate Conception Seminary but more often than not we used the shorter form, *Darlington*, the name for that section of Mahwah, to refer to the place we lived and were schooled. The *February* referred to that time of year from our return from Christmas break to the Easter break and usually in the negative, because we were never allowed off the grounds. Thus, a *Darlington February* was a kind of bleak time in our lives.

As we are almost at February I can't help but think back to those days even though our days at OLMC are nothing like that. As I write this, **Discovering Christ**, fully booked, begins tomorrow evening. In another two weeks, our first **Men's Cornerstone** since 2020 will be held and a week after that only the third *Journey Retreat* (Confirmation retreat) at the retreat center in Kearney since March of 2020. The faith community here at Mount Carmel is growing and coming back to life after the pause created by the pandemic.

February also brings with it the **2023 Annual Appeal** of the Archdiocese of Newark which will begin with Pledge Sunday the weekend of February 4-5. Pledge Sunday refers to the weekend of the in-pew solicitation but letters from the Cardinal on behalf of the Appeal should already be arriving at parishioners' homes. But before all of that, I want to give you a report on the **2022 Appeal** which just concluded. The Appeal saw an increase in the amount donated from the parish from \$303,386 in 2021 to \$330,557 in 2022. And the number of donors increased from 419 to 481. As we began the Appeal last year I wrote that I hoped we could get to 500 participants. We didn't make it but an increase of 62 donors is a sign of great progress. You may remember that my goal, over these last 25 years, has always been the increase in the number of our parish households who support the many ministries of the Church of Newark. Thank you, to each and every one of you who participated, in this work. And because of your kind generosity to the Archdiocese, the parish has received a rebate of \$166,467 which has gone a long way to help with the shortfall to parish revenues caused by the pandemic. On the **homepage** of our website you will find a Thank You Message from the Cardinal.

I want to go back again to the **Men's Cornerstone Retreat**. Since the slow-down in the pandemic, if we can call it that and if it holds true, the thought has been coming to me over and over again of how much more Jesus wants to offer us. Maybe it started in the days of the lockdown when life was so radically changed in ways we could never have imagined. So much of our lives were changed by that experience and I doubt that any of us are truly back 100% to where we were before March of 2020. I see that in the number of people whom I saw regularly before the

pandemic but I haven't seen since. I see that in the ebb and flow of mask wearing, as each new variant makes its mark on our health. And it seems to me people are more conscious of how close they are when speaking with others. And I think we are all conscious of how things can quickly change and are beyond our control.

In all of this, the Lord walks with us, by our side, never abandoning us. Jesus wants to offer us fullness of life no matter the circumstances that surround us, to offer us a friendship that will sustain us every day, in our personal struggles, societal challenges, international crises and more. But we need to open that door for him. **Cornerstone** offers a way to open that door, not through lectures but through the eyes, hearts and experience of men just like you who have found in Jesus a source of support and friendship. I have a very practical suggestion for the men who attended the **House Gatherings** we had in the fall. If they opened a door for you, take the next step. If you had an experience of faith, either yours or another man's, follow up with **Cornerstone**. You never know how the Lord may want to continue to touch your heart. Registration information can be found to the right of this column. I look forward to sharing 26 hours with you on the 27th-28th.

**A NOTE OF GRATITUDE
FROM FR. FELIX**



Dear Friends in Christ

With boundless appreciation, I wish to express my heartfelt gratitude to Msgr. Ron, my brother priests, Frs. Anthony & Frank, Deacon Robert and the beloved staff and parishioners of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. I owe all of you a deep debt of gratitude for the cares, sacrifices, advice, gifts, donations during my 4 months in your parish. I am greatly honored and indebted to have your encouragement and support.

When I think of what you do for OneHopeChildren Foundation, I remember vividly a simple story from a very wealthy man who was asked in a telephone interview by a radio presenter, what made him a happy man in life? As he giggled and waited for a second, he said "I have gone through four stages of happiness in my life and finally I understood the meaning of true happiness."

The first stage was to accumulate wealth and means. But at this stage I did not get the happiness I wanted. Then came the second stage of collecting valuables and items but I realized that the effect of this is also temporary and the luster of valuable things does not last long. Then came the third stage of getting big projects. That was when I was holding 95% of diesel supply, and the largest vessel owner, in Africa, Asia and Europe. But even here I did not get the happiness I had imagined. The fourth stage was the time a friend of mine asked me to buy wheelchairs for some 200 disabled children and perhaps pay their tuition to get the basic education they needed. At the friend's request, I immediately bought the wheelchairs and arranged to pay for their education.

My friend insisted that I go with him to deliver the wheelchairs and tuition vouchers myself. There, I gave the wheelchairs to the children and the vouchers to the school administrators with my own hands. I saw the glow of happiness on the faces of these children. I saw them all sitting on the wheelchairs, moving around and having fun. I saw them excited about learning and desire to be educated. It was as if they had arrived at a picnic spot where they are sharing a jackpot winning. I felt REAL joy inside me. The words of David McKay that "true happiness comes only by making others happy" struck home. Indeed, I felt it; I smelt it, since "happiness is a perfume you cannot pour on others without getting a few drops on yourself."

When I was leaving one of the kids grabbed my legs. I bent down and asked the child: "Do you need something else?" The answer this child gave me not only made me happy but also changed my attitude towards life completely. This child said: "I want to remember your face so that when I meet you in heaven, I will be able to recognize you and thank you once again."

My Dear Parishioners of OLMC, the above anecdote literally tells the impact of your gifts and the \$38,110 of your kind donations to the children of ONEHOPECHILDREN FOUNDATION. You're giving them wings to fly; drying their tears; offering them music to sing; changing their world; creating a future for them; making a difference in their lives. We owe you much gratitude and we remain grateful. The children will remember your faces when they meet you in heaven. They will recognize you and thank you once again.

1. Isaiah 49:3, 5-6

Today's excerpt from the 2nd Servant Song of Isaiah alternately identifies the Servant as one of a variety of historical figures (Moses, Jeremiah, Hezekiah) or as a personification of the nation or ultimately in the eyes of the Christian community, Jesus Christ. The Servant is called from the womb, chosen by God to show the people the way that leads to faith. God expands the Servant's work beyond the nation to the world, bringing justice, light, peace and the good news of salvation to all the broken, displaced, and unwanted who can now experience the love, care and compassion of their Creator.

2. 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

The theological center of Paul's thought in his letters is what God has done in Christ. Often the reason for this exposition is that a particular community has tried to reshape that Gospel according to their own experience, keeping the freedoms, the gifts, and privileges, while ignoring that which was viewed as onerous, the cross, the need to surrender themselves, Paul's authority. Paul begins this letter to the community of Corinth, guilty of the above, by calling them to a holiness which goes beyond their stubborn, smug and proud attitudes.

3. John 1:29-34

In this Gospel of John, the primary role of the Baptist is to acknowledge Jesus as Son of God. This high Christology is also atonement theology; Jesus' death will be a sacrificial death for the sake of others. In this it is clearly reminiscent of the Suffering Servant of Isaiah. The Gospel witness of the Baptist also points out the pre-existence of the Son, as well as the Spirit remaining with Jesus, implying a mutual indwelling of the Son and the Spirit, the Spirit with which Jesus, Himself, will baptize.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. If you had to announce Jesus as the Messiah of the world, what would you say?
2. If the Messiah were proclaimed to you, what would you personally do first?
3. Are you delighted that you're baptized? Why?
