Communal Baptisms are held every month on the first Sunday at 1:30pm and on the third Saturday at 11:00am (with some exceptions). Register a month or two in advance for the Baptismal Program.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (Confessions)

Saturday 1:00pm-2:00pm
Other times by pre-arranged appt. with a priest. Communal Penance celebrations (with individual confessions) are celebrated in Advent and Lent and will be announced.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who wish to enter the Catholic faith and Catholics who wish to complete the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are most welcome to begin the journey at any time. Call the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

Dear Friends,

What's Next? Whenever I turn on the news, or get up in the morning, I find myself asking that question. And wondering what happened during the night, or at the end of a day, or anytime in between. What crisis, what intervention, what lawsuit, what tirade—what whatever will have happened to upset my balance, raise my blood pressure and cause me to wonder—where is the world going? Where is our country going? What future is there for the children of this age and what will it look like? And then add to that the latest projections about what AI will do to the labor market. All of it can drain a person's strength, emotional stability and confidence in the future.

A lot of questions. Not many answers. But I do know one answer—faith. My faith tells me we are not alone. My faith tells me with the Christ at my side I can face this uncertain future. My faith tells me that it is the Christ upon whom, and in whom, I find my security and the encouragement I need to navigate the ever-changing landscape of the world in which I live, including the uncertainties of my life after July 1, 2026.

Men of the parish, if you have ever asked any of these same questions of yourself and want to encounter the One who wants to walk with you through the zigs and zags of your own life, register for **Men's Cornerstone** and know other men have walked that same road and have discovered that same Lord who wants to walk with them. **Register now.**

As with last year, Pledge Sunday for the (Archdiocesan) **Annual Appeal** is not scheduled to take place until the first weekend in March, but, you know from the mailings that the Appeal has already begun. As I have always done, I want to give a report on the Appeal that just ended. The parish pledged \$429,676.79, from 542 donors, of which \$418,207.16 was received. In a few weeks, the parish will receive back a rebate of \$122,000. Thank you. Thank you. Thank you.

Since the very beginning of my pastorate here, almost 29 years ago, the key word has always been **participation**. My goal, year in and year out has been to consistently increase the number of parish "households" involved in this support—to see the number of donors from Mount Carmel increase. Thanks to your response, the parish jumped from 490 household two year ago to 542 this past year. Again, thank you, thank you, thank you.

The Annual Appeal funds what the Church is supposed to be about. First and foremost the Church must be about *Proclaiming the Gospel*, announcing to the world it is loved by Jesus Christ. While this is the responsibility of every baptized Catholic, there is a special place for those called to the priestly ministry and so *Forming Future Priests* must be a part of the Church's work, as well as *Supporting Retired Clergy*, (myself included in a few short months), those who have labored long and hard in the vineyard. *Passing on the*

Faith to future generations is also an essential work of the Church, especially these days when there is so great an opportunity in Gen Z (or so we're told) who are not satisfied with what the world calls "fulfillment." In these times of great need, living Jesus' love in concrete ways drives the Church's mission in *Caring for the Poor and the Vulnerable*. This last mission of the Church is so important that it receives the largest portion of the funds raised through the **Appeal**. I will have more to share on the needs met by the **Appeal** as we get closer to Pledge Sunday.

I have included the **Appeal** in my column now because I ask all those who have participated in the past to act now. Don't wait until Pledge Weekend. Make your gift or pledge now either using the materials you received in the mail or the link to the campaign that appears on the homepage of our website. And be sure to identify your parish, Our Lady of Mount Carmel—Ridgewood, so the gift adds to the rebate the parish will receive next February.

TODAY'S READINGS

1. Isaiah 49:3, 5-6

Today's excerpt from the 2nd Servant Song of Isaiah alternately identifies the Servant as one of a variety of historical figures (Moses, Jeremiah, Hezekiah) or as a personification of the nation or ultimately in the eyes of the Christian community, Jesus Christ. The Servant is called from the womb, chosen by God to show the people the way that leads to faith. God expands the Servant's work beyond the nation to the world, bringing justice, light, peace and the good news of salvation to all the broken, displaced, and unwanted who can now experience the love, care and compassion of their Creator.

2. 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

The theological center of Paul's thought in his letters is what God has done in Christ. Often the reason for this exposition is that a particular community has tried to reshape that Gospel according to their own experience, keeping the freedoms, the gifts, and privileges, while ignoring that which was viewed as onerous, the cross, the need to surrender themselves, Paul's authority. Paul begins this letter to the community of Corinth, guilty of the above, by calling them to a holiness which goes beyond their stubborn, smug and proud attitudes.

3. John 1:29-34

In this Gospel of John, the primary role of the Baptist is to acknowledge Jesus as Son of God. This high Christology is also atonement theology; Jesus' death will be a sacrificial death for the sake of others. In this it is clearly reminiscent of the Suffering Servant of Isaiah. The Gospel witness of the Baptist also points out the pre-existence of the Son, as well as the Spirit remaining with Jesus, implying a mutual indwelling of the Son and the Spirit, the Spirit with which Jesus, Himself, will baptize.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. If you had to announce Jesus as the Messiah of the world, what would you say?
2. If the Messiah were proclaimed to you, what would you do first?
3. Are you delighted, encouraged, peaceful, grateful that you're baptized? Does it really make any difference to you? Why?

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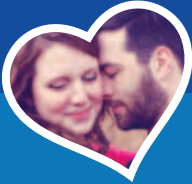
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
