RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who wish to enter the Catholic faith and Catholics who wish to complete the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are most welcome to begin the journey at any time.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

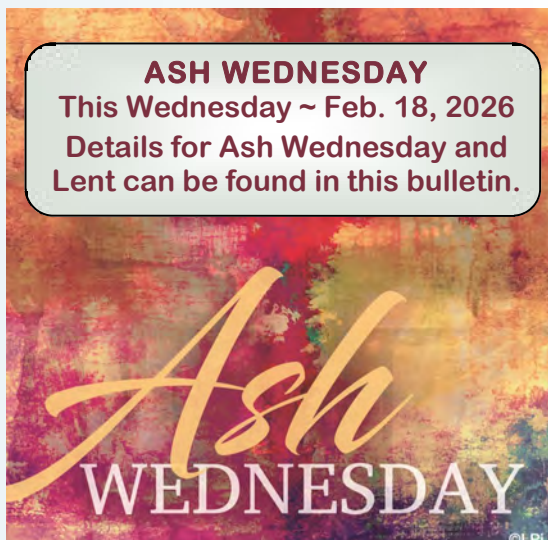

Dear Friends,

As I write this, we have finished the third session of the fourth go-round of *ChristLife*, a journey for evangelization. It is amazing to me how this Catholic apostolate, dedicated to helping the Church evangelize, continues to “draw a full house,” of interested participants. It’s especially rewarding this year to be offering it with St. Gabriel’s, our neighbors, as a kind of kick off for them to incorporate it into their parish identity. I have heard over and over again over these past three years how many have grown in their faith through *Christ Life*.

As I reflected on this reality, it struck me that that is what a parish should be about—growing in Christ, both individually and together as a community. St. Paul touches on this in his Letter to the Ephesians when he tells us that we must grow into the full stature of Christ, to “grow in every way into him who is the head, Christ. (Eph. 4:15). Growing in Christ is not some mental concept, like growing in my knowledge of him, what he did or what he said. It is relational, my encounter with the living Christ who becomes so close and so intimate with me that Paul can say “yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me.” (Gal. 2:20). The journey we are all on is to be that close to Christ that the words of St. Paul come true for each of us. One of the strengths of our Church is that it has recognized so many different roads on which to travel to reach that goal. First and foremost, is the sacramental nature of our Church, and at its heart, the Eucharist. It is truly Christ present in these sacred moments, in Baptism, in the Anointing of the Sick, in Matrimony, in being fed each week at the table of the Lord. Beyond that, there are so many paths to deepen that, *ChristLife*, the *Neocatechumenal Way*, *Cursillo*, *Marriage Encounter*, *Cornerstone*, *Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration*, the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* and so many others but all offering the same goal—a deeper encounter with Christ which leads us to grow into “him who is our head, Christ.”

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Catholics traditionally “do” something for Lent, In my column in past years, on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, I would write these or similar words, “Do something that’s a real sacrifice. Challenge yourself in ways that you never thought possible.” This year, I would like to suggest a new approach. Ask yourself, “how can I allow Christ to grow in me?” “How can I grow in Christ?” So often we see Lent as a test of our willpower—to make a Lenten resolution and see if we can stick with it. Look at Lent differently this year. What can I do that welcomes Christ into my daily life so that I can become more like him? How can I stay focused on Christ during the day so that he may transform me into himself and his presence in the world? Put that as your Lenten goal and find some tool (prayer, fasting, alms giving, Scripture reading, sacrifice) that helps you do that. And be sure to join us on Ash

Wednesday to begin this journey. Masses are celebrated at 6:30AM, 8:30AM, noon and 7:30PM, with services at 4:00PM and 5:30PM.

As I mentioned in my column last weekend, **Commitment Sunday for the Annual Appeal**, originally scheduled for 3/7-8, will be held in two weeks, 2/28-3/1. The message of the Appeal is actually an outgrowth from what I said in the first part of my column. The Church's mission is to announce the Good News, to Form Disciples, to Pass On The Faith and to live the faith so as to be Christ's hands in our world. Forming disciples is not an intellectual activity. It is to help people *Discover Christ* in their lives and enter into a personal encounter with him. Do you want to be part of that? Are you willing to be part of that? One way to support this work is by **participation** in the **Annual Appeal**. You should have received Appeal materials in the mail, as well as a letter from me. If not, there will be materials in the church on that Sunday. You can use the envelope to make a pledge and mail it directly to the Archdiocese or you can go online directly to their website or use the link on Mount Carmel's website. Whichever means you choose, be a part of this Mission to bring the Gospel to the world, so badly in need of it. Be sure to identify Mount Carmel-Ridgewood as your parish so the parish gets the credit for your gift. More in two weeks.

Today, at the 11:00 Mass the parish celebrates the *Rite of Sending of the Catechumens for Election* and the *Candidates* (already baptized as Catholics but continuing on for the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation and those coming into Full Communion of the Catholic Church) for the *Call to Continuing Conversion*, to be celebrated by the Bishop next Saturday (*candidates*) and Sunday (*catechumens*). Please be sure to read this week's column on the *OCIA* for more details, as well as the names of those being sent. And remember—this is not the inquirer whom the Church received into the catechumenate last week. He will go next year. Please keep all of them in your prayers.

**ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK
2026 LENTEN REGULATIONS**

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially”, or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 22, 2026 to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 31, 2026.**

**Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

The **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults** is the faith journey process centered on the beliefs and teachings of the Catholic Church to guide an inquirer towards a personal relationship with Jesus Christ through the sacraments that are celebrated in the Catholic Church during Easter.



There are three types of inquirers: 1) **Catholics**—Adults who seek to receive Confirmation and, in certain cases, also the Eucharist; 2) **Baptized Christians**—Adults whose baptism from Christian denominations that is recognized by the Catholic Church. They seek to be in full communion in the Catholic Church by receiving Confirmation and the Eucharist; and 3) **Non-Baptized**—Adults who have not been baptized or received baptism that is not recognized by the Catholic Church. They seek to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church by receiving Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist in the Easter Vigil.

The OCIA journey of faith celebrates the **Rite of Sending Catechumens for Election and Candidates for the Calling to Continuing Conversion** at the local parish. The Rite of Sending canonically sends off the catechumens and candidates to the Bishop who will celebrate the **Rites of Election and Calling to Continuing Conversion** to prepare them to receive Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. In the Archdiocese of Newark, Archbishop Cardinal Joseph Tobin will celebrate these two Rites at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart Cathedral.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel is blessed to have two catechumens and six candidates for Easter 2026. The catechumens are: *Kim Derkacs; Jennifer Phan.* The candidates are: *Brian Chech; Evangeline Espinal; Antonio Gonzalez; Rachel Orlando; Jamie Eliya; Jae Oh.*

Msgr. Ron will celebrate the Rite of Sending for these candidates and catechumens on Sunday, February 15, 2026, at the 11:00AM Mass. Dcn. Bob Liwanag will assist.

The parish community is invited to pray for these catechumens and candidates as their faith journey to know Jesus Christ at a personal level grows and deepens.

TODAY'S READINGS

1. Sirach 15:15-20

While the Greeks imagined themselves as pawns of fickle gods, Jesus Ben Sirach understood Israel to be children of a loving God who gave them the freedom of making their own choices. To choose God and his commandments is to choose wisely, to choose life. Other choices will only lead to death. And no one can conceal his/her choices from the eyes of God, who knows and sees all.

2. 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

For Paul, the wisdom of which Ben Sirach writes is not even good enough. True wisdom, a wisdom God had in mind from all eternity, is found in Christ crucified. Having faith in Christ crucified, though it may confound the wisdom of the rulers and sages of the day, leads to life eternal, a life no one can even imagine.

3. Matthew 5:17-37

Amidst the heated controversy in the early Church over the place of the Jewish law, Matthew, in this further explanation of the Beatitudes, presents the teachings of Jesus as not only the fulfillment of the Law, but as its extension to the realm of grace where love knows no limits, where their righteousness will surpass the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees. To follow Jesus is to follow the way of total self-giving.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. In what ways do you feel blessed in your commitment to follow God's commandments (as opposed to other pathways through life)?
2. Wisdom is a gift of the Spirit, Paul tells us. When has Wisdom been revealed to you and righted a wrong course you may have been on?
3. Do you use the words and teachings of Jesus as ever-present guides for living a life of greater love and self-giving or is it the "wisdom of this age" that is your "guiding light"?
