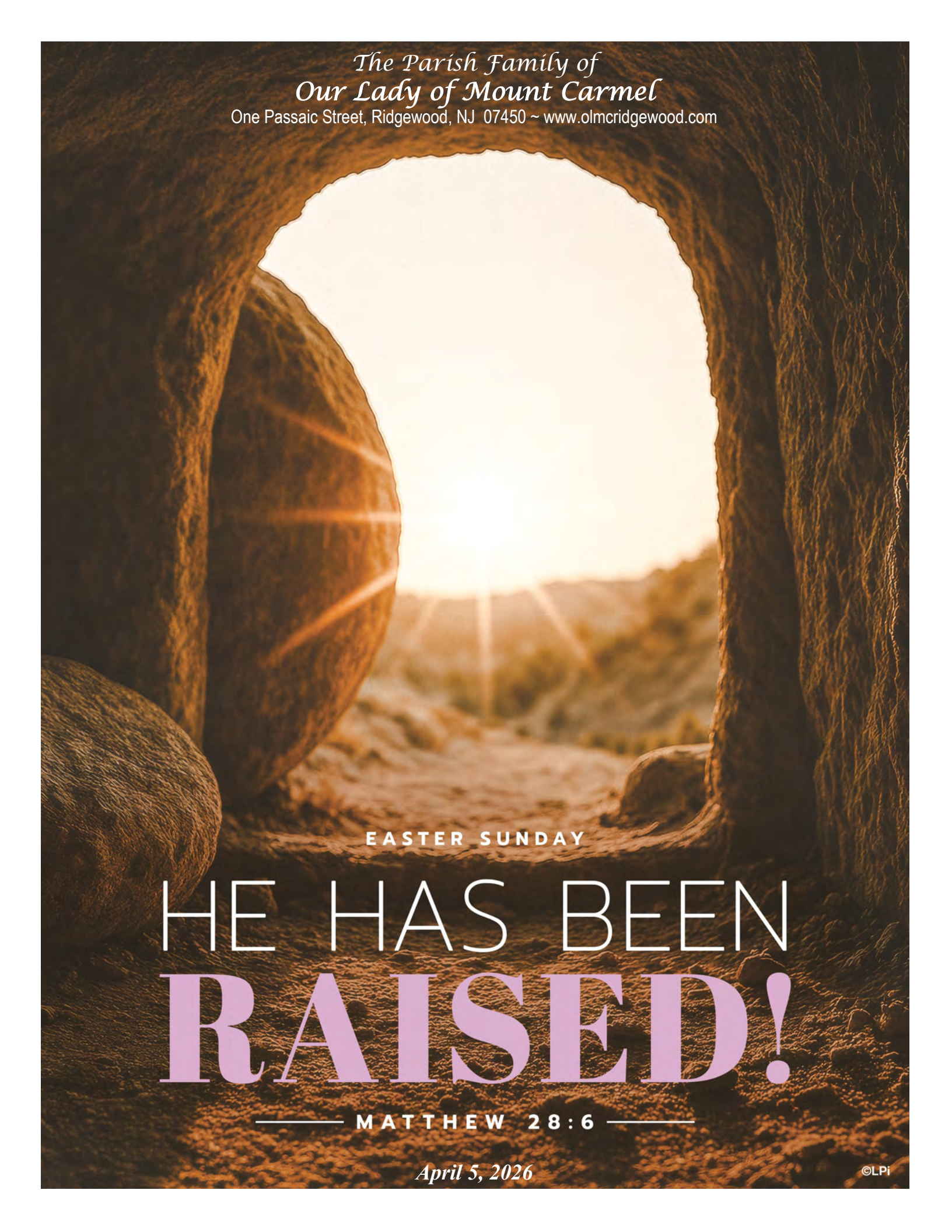

Dear Friends,

As you might expect, I have started to go through all sorts of things I've collected over the years. Among them, I had made it a habit of collecting numerous articles I thought might some day be used in a homily or a reflection. One of those was a story of two young children. They were both eight at the time and their names are Orel and Marya. At the time, they had been neighbors for nearly a year. They talked, they watched television together, they shared favorite foods and treats. She liked his mother's eggplant dish. He liked her father's rice and lamb. They are best friends. He is wild and impulsive; she is smart, up-beat and strong-willed. But friends put up with that in each other.

Orel and Marya were patients in a hospital in Jerusalem. Orel suffered brain damage during a Hamas rocket attack from Gaza. He is an Israeli Jew. Marya's spinal cord was severed when an Israeli jet fighter mistakenly hit the car in which she was riding. She is a Palestinian Muslim. They don't understand. They were kids. They play. They talk. They cruise the hospital corridors in their wheelchairs. Someone forgot to tell them they were supposed to be enemies. They had developed a kinship that defied ancient hatreds. That bond had brought their families, of different backgrounds, cultures and religions together as well. And it inspired the hospital staff, volunteers and parents of other children in the hospital as well.

Like the world into which Orel and Marya were born, our world is so often filled with the darkness of the tomb, the thousand tombs of our hardened hearts, of our despairing spirits, of our disappointments and our dashed hopes, of our misunderstandings and misjudgments and our refusals to allow the love of the God who created us to raise us from these tombs of our own self-confinement. And so much happening daily in our country, and so much of the rhetoric we hear every day just deepens the darkness of those tombs.

Today we come to renew our faith, to be inspired—no, more than inspired, to be graced by the resurrection of Jesus, now freed from His tomb of death, and to believe anew that He has the power to free us as well. The One Who was dead is now alive. The insulted, beaten, scourged and crucified One is now risen in glory, and the glorified One shares His life with us, to be, for us, our light so we may be for Him, His light in the world.

When you hate, and hurt, you are still in the tomb—come out!

When you seek your own advantage, and care only for success, you are still in the tomb—come out!

When your mind is closed to others and your heart to their needs, to the poor, to strangers, to people of different cultures, religions, race, you are still in the tomb—come out!

When the violence captured in the media, whether

internationally or on the streets of our country does not move your heart to wish and pray for mutual respect and peace, you are still in the tomb—come out!

When prejudice, despair, greed and death rule your life, you are still in the tomb—come out!

But when compassion, generosity, humility and selflessness triumph, it is Easter for you!

When love reigns and good stares down evil, it is Easter for you!

When resurrection is not only an event but a way of life, it is Easter for you!

When hope dispels fear and despair, it is Easter for you!

When the light of faith illuminates the winter hearts and exhausted spirit, so as to know that we are embraced by God, it is Easter for you!

And when it is Easter for you, the Risen Lord truly lives in you and when the Risen Lord lives in you, it is Easter for the world.

And what higher calling can there be—to be Easter for the world, especially in our time and place, at this crossroad of our history.

The catechumens demonstrate the deepening of their faith that will lead them to become elect, preparing to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church. This sacred event to become a Catholic happens all over the world during the Easter Vigil. The Catholic Church increases with these newly baptized adults. Alleluia! Alleluia!

OLMC joyfully welcomed *Kim Derkacs* and *Jennifer Phan* into the Catholic Church when they received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist at Mt. Carmel's Easter Vigil—Saturday, April 4th. Huge gratitude to the OLMC community for their prayers and encouragement.

The next group on this OCIA faith journey is the baptized candidates consisting of Catholics and those from Christian denominations whose baptisms are recognized by the Catholic Church. 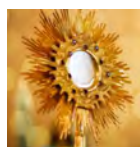

1. Acts of the Apostles 10:34, 37-43

For the first time in the house of a Gentile, represented by the Roman officer Cornelius, Peter announces the *kerygma*, the essential expression of the Christian faith. This word announces that (1) Jesus was sent by God and empowered by the Spirit, (2) went about healing and doing good, (3) was crucified, died and rose to life, (4) was seen by witnesses (5) whom He commissioned to continue His mission, (6) for the forgiveness of sins and the gift of new life in God. Peter recognizes the privilege that is his, and others, in being a witness of this Jesus, and, in a revelation that surprises him, that the Christ now calls him (Peter) to announce this to the gentile world.

2. Colossians 3:1-4 or 1 Corinthians 5:6-8

(Presider's Choice)

The invitation in both readings, either one of which may be chosen by the Presider, is the same—to cast out our former way of life, to live anew in and with the presence of the Risen Christ. In Colossians, it is represented as the choice between what is above and what is below. In Corinthians it is the choice between leavened (the old yeast) and unleavened (the fresh batch of dough). In both cases, believers are urged to live in the power of Christ's Resurrection, a power that can bring life and hope to all the believer does and to everyone with whom the believer lives.

3. John 20:1-9

The excerpted reading seems to stop short. Mary, (Magdalene) has been at the tomb, presumably with the other women for a proper anointing of Jesus' body. But it is not there, so she runs to tell Peter. Now he runs to the tomb, with the unnamed disciple (the one Jesus loves—John). The funeral wrappings are described and some scholars believe the description means that they (the wrappings) continue to preserve the contours of the body. John believes, Peter does not. In any case, the empty tomb holds a mystery and serves as a reminder that coming to faith, in its fullness, is no simple task.

3. Or Luke 24:13-35 (Presider's Choice)

Distressed by the death of their Lord and friend and by reports by some women that He has been seen, raised from the dead, two disciples walk a dusty and painful road out of Jerusalem. They encounter a stranger who opens their eyes to a true Messiah and in a shared meal at the end of the journey, their eyes are opened to Who that stranger really was—Jesus, the Resurrected Lord and Messiah.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Are you an Easter person, celebrating Christ's victory over the forces of death and darkness? How does your life show it?
2. Does your life truly reflect the happiness and joy of living out the Resurrection of Jesus? Why or why not?
3. Easter's gifts are hope and love. Especially considering the state of the world and the nation today, where in your life is hope and love needed the most.
