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Dear Friends,

As I write for this weekend, the parish is preparing for a special moment in its spiritual life. Beginning this weekend, and continuing into May, there will be five celebrations of the Eucharist in which 138 of our children will receive their First Holy Communion. That's the smallest number since 1995, but still a great cause for rejoicing. After eight months of preparation, they will come to the altar to receive Jesus' greatest gift to His Church, **HIMSELF, IN HIS REAL PRESENCE**, for the life of the believer. And in less than two months Bishop Saporito will give the gift of the Holy Spirit to 143 of our 9th graders in the Sacrament of Confirmation, the smallest number since 2002, but, again, cause for rejoicing. In between those celebrations, Deacon Robert Burkot, who has been with us this past year, will be ordained to the priesthood by Cardinal Tobin and will celebrate his 1st Mass here on Sunday, May 28th at 12:30PM. If you're not away for the Memorial Day weekend, I hope you will reserve that time and date to join him in thanksgiving to God for His call to priesthood. And the Mass will be followed by a reception in the Parish Center.

It is a good time to remember that we are a sacramental church, that we believe that Christ acts through designated celebrational moments, during which He has promised to be present in a powerful way to deepen the life of the believer's union with Himself. These celebrational moments, of which there are seven, form the backbone, as it were, of the Church's spiritual life and as a Catholic walks through life, they mark his/her continued re-creation in the image of Jesus, the 2nd Adam. This is why we believe these moments are so important, because they do effectuate that change into that new man, or woman, who now becomes the living Christ in the world. And this is why the pandemic, with its social distancing and "virtual everything" has proven to be such a danger to the sacramental life of the Church.

As we come to these moments which are the highlight of the parish's life in April, May and June, I like to remind everyone of their significance for us, especially after three years of struggling to return to a spiritual "normal." Of course we can pray anywhere, anytime. Of course we can read Scripture anywhere, anytime. But the special gift of Christ to His Church are those graced moments when He has told us He would be present and active in the community. These sacramental moments nourish the believer on his/her journey. This is especially true of the Eucharist for it is in being fed by the Lord with His own Body and Blood that we find the nourishment to stay close to Him and to be His presence in the world, **for the life of the world.**

Of course, this is not without its challenge. The challenge is in what follows. Being formed in a faith-filled environment is not a one-shot deal. It's not a sprint; it's a marathon. In a world in which we have little trust in people and institutions, (e.g. government, the media, the church, etc.), the kind of

trust the Lord offers us can only be built slowly, in an environment into which we invite the Lord, day after day, after day. And that environment has to be multi-dimensional and multi-faceted, the home (through prayer and Scripture), the classroom (through instruction and formation in some form of Religious Education model) and worship (weekly attendance at Mass). It's only when all three are happening that there is real hope of finding in Jesus that trustworthy companion and friend that He is. So, the challenge to the families of our first communicants is to make all three things happen. I hope and pray our parents are ready, willing and able to accept this challenge. That challenge is even more pressing in the context of the pandemic we have all just lived through.

As Catholics, we need to rediscover the power of the Sacraments in our lives, to participate in them more faithfully and more fruitfully and give example to these children of ours' who come to them for the first time, that we really believe in how special they are.

Now for the mundane. For the first time in a few weeks I want to up-date you on the **Annual Appeal**. While the parish is ahead of where we were last year, both in dollars, \$276,208, vs. \$264,195 and in terms of donors, 400 vs 382, we still have a long way to go to last year's totals, \$334,740 and 482. And I was hoping we could get to at least 500 donors, or maybe even with a miracle, 600. As I have always pleaded, a gift from every registered household in the parish. It is a good cause, especially the diocesan support for Catholic Charities that comes through the **Appeal**. And it helps the parish because of the 50% rebate the parish gets over our stretch goal which we have already surpassed. But in order to qualify, the pledges, **not the payment**, must be made by June 30th. So I ask once again if you have not done so, please make a pledge which helps both the Archdiocese and our parish. The easiest way is to go to the parish homepage and you will see the icon/link directly to the **Annual Appeal**.

And two other appeals. **World Youth Day** is a gathering of young people from all over the world, for prayer, instruction and reflection, and sharing of faith with one another, bishops and the Holy Father, every three or four years or so. This year it will be held in Portugal in August. A number of our youth from the parish will attend this moving experience. They will be conducting two fundraisers in the coming weeks, a Volleyball tournament and **Pennies for Pilgrims**. Please check out the information about both efforts in today's bulletin and help them in their efforts to get to Portugal for this important moment for the youth of the world.

1. Acts of the Apostles 2:14, 22-23

This excerpt is part of Peter's proclamation to the crowds, immediately after the Pentecost event. Standing with the Eleven, as a clear sign of their "oneness" in the Holy Spirit, and representing the New Israel (together, they are Twelve, as the new twelve tribes), Peter witnesses to the life of Jesus, to the signs and wonders worked by His hands, and, finally, to His suffering and death, but most especially to His victory over death in his Resurrection. In fulfillment of David's prophetic words in Psalm 16, "God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses."

2. 1 Peter 1:17-21

Probably written to Christians in Asia Minor facing the threat of persecution, the ancient writer affirms the Christian identity and dignity of his readers and sets forth the norms for Christian living in a pagan world. Sanctified and reborn in the sacrifice of Jesus, believers can no longer return to their old way of life. That sacrifice will lead those who are faithful to eternal life.

3. Luke 24:13-35

In this familiar excerpt, in the journey of the two disciples from the Jerusalem of the Easter morn, Luke tells the Church what is necessary to recognize the Risen Lord in its midst, faith and the Holy Spirit. The death of Jesus brings the hopes of these disciples to an abrupt end. They explain their loss to an unidentified stranger (actually, the Risen Lord) on the road from Jerusalem and the reports of the empty tomb (which clearly they do not believe). At that point, the stranger takes their story and throws new light on it, through His understanding of Scripture, but, most especially, as He breaks bread with them, a moment of recognition for them of Who He really is. Luke's teaching is now clear. The Risen Lord can come to us in the form of a stranger, and in Scripture and, most especially, in the Eucharist, the "Breaking of the Bread."

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Our own journey through life, these past years have been filled with doubt, disappointment, depression, suffering, anxiety and fear. Did Jesus help you cope? What about now? Are you in a better place? Because of your faith?
2. Is this moment in your life calling you to understand life in a different way, as Jesus did for the two in today's Gospel? Is it giving you a new enlightenment, a new insight that the pace of life kept hidden from you?
3. Have you ever been Jesus for someone else in that kind of moment, with a word, a presence, a listening ear, heart, to help them gain a new perspective on life's values and purpose?
