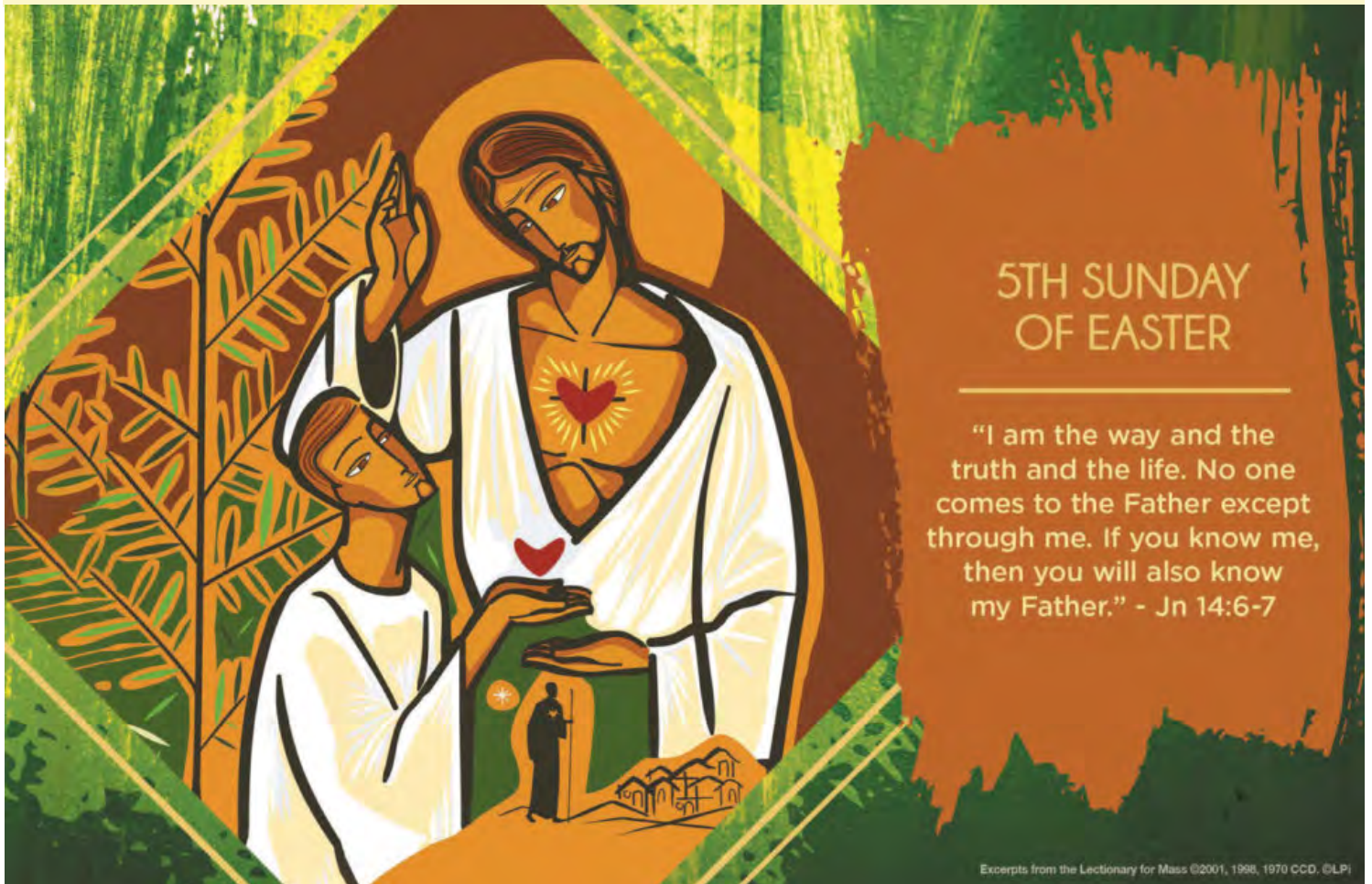

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Dear Friends,

Varia – different, changing or diverse

-Have you ever looked at the last page of text in the bulletin? Besides the Mass Intentions for the week and the presiders for the next weekend, you'll find something called **TODAY'S READINGS**. In it, you'll find an exegesis of each of the Scripture passages used in the liturgy (Mass) for the day. **Exegesis** is a form of literary study in which a particular Biblical text is interpreted and analyzed, using textual, cultural and historical analysis to examine the meaning. Msgr. Sheeran, when he presides, will most often give an exegesis of the individual passages immediately before they are proclaimed. You will also find this (exegesis) on that last page of text in the bulletin, both online and in hard copy. You might ask, why should I read it? Because it might help you understand the context of the reading, the particular concerns of the sacred author, the circumstances in which the community of faith found itself at the time of the writing or the connection of the reading with the other readings of the day. The exegesis is not a homily but the "raw materials" from which the homily should be composed.

How can you use **TODAY'S READINGS**? Ideally, the column should be read sometime before the Mass, along with the readings, themselves. In this way, when the readings are proclaimed you will not only be familiar with them, but will have some understanding of their background and meaning. If this can't be done, the alternative is to read the exegesis sometime after Mass and the, in the light of the readings, the exegesis and the homily, do some reflection on the **REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK**. I know some families who made it a practice to discuss the reflection questions during their ride home from Mass. In any case, even if you do it when you get to church for Mass, try to read the **TODAY'S READINGS** feature. I guarantee it will help you get a better understanding of Scripture.

-Two events this weekend, week. Young people are once again at the doors of the church soliciting "pennies for pilgrims." This is to help support the young people of the parish in their efforts to be part of **World Youth Day**, the gathering of youth from around the world with Pope Francis in Portugal in August. Obviously this is a major effort on their part but well worth their while. Please help in any way possible.

-Are you a history buff? Or are you curious about the history of our parish. During his time with us Deacon Robert Burkot (who is about to be ordained a priest) has spent many hours researching the 134 year (did you know the parish is that old?) history of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. On Wednesday evening he will give a presentation on his findings, including pictures. It might be a surprisingly interesting evening. I invite all to come. Details are elsewhere in this bulletin.

-Once again, I write on behalf of the **Annual Appeal**. This

time focusing on the participation in it that helps the parish. I hope you know I will always be transparent with you. Notice I didn't say "as transparent," because you're either transparent or you're not, there is no "half transparency." Before Covid, the parishes of the Archdiocese shared a 50/50% rebate with the Archdiocese of every dollar over its goal. During Covid, when so many parishes were badly hurt in their income stream, that rebate to the parishes was increased to 100% over goal. Now it has gone back to a 50/50 split, but this time with the understanding that the 50% that stays with the Archdiocese will be given to parishes in need. I serve on several boards and I can tell you that there are many parishes in the Archdiocese desperately in need of help and these restricted rebate funds will help a lot. But that means that we will receive substantially less of a rebate that we had received in the recent past and while our collections have stabilized, returning to full programming, post-pandemic, has seen an increase in expenses. So, in addition to the great work **Catholic Charities** does with funds from the **Appeal**, which I wrote about last week, your participation in the **Appeal** will be a definite help to our local community. Please join the 417 of your fellow parish households who have already committed to this effort, if for no other reason than it will help us carry on every ministry here in the parish. Our goal this year was to reach 600 parish households. And there is a key date—all pledges (not redemption) must be made by June 30th to qualify for that rebate. Thanks for your consideration.

1. Acts of the Apostles 6:1-7

As the early community grows, there arose a need to care for those who were unable to care for themselves, such as the widows. But as the need grows, so do divisions. It is not clear why, but those who speak Greek feel they are receiving less care than those who speak Hebrew. The concern rises to the level of the Twelve who grasp that their real role within the community is primarily to preach and to pray. In their role as shepherds of the flock, they propose a solution in the calling of others to fulfill new tasks in service to the community.

2. 1 Peter 2:4-9

The author invites his readers to be built into an edifice of living stones. It is a design, not of their own making, but of God's making. This spiritual house carries with it the promise of roots and family because it is built upon Jesus Christ, who is the cornerstone of God's building. But for some who reject Him, He will not be the cornerstone, but the stumbling stone.

3. John 14:1-12

Today's excerpted passage begins the lengthy section called the Final Discourse, words spoken by Jesus to his disciples during their last meal together. It begins with His warning that He will be leaving them to return to the Father's house, where He will prepare a place for them. In answering Thomas' question, Jesus launches into a monologue on the Divine Relationship. Jesus pronounces Himself the way, the truth and the life. He does not teach about them, He IS them. Those who seek God (Father) will find God in Jesus and can now share His life. Because they share His life, they will carry on His works.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Even with life "back to normal," these are difficult days, uncertainty, divisions, rancor. When our hearts are really troubled by so many things, do you find solace in your faith?
2. In the 2nd Reading, Peter calls the Church "a spiritual house." Is the Church, both locally (in the parish) and as an Archdiocese offering the shelter of hope and comfort in these troubling times?
3. How can your love be more like Christ's? How can your service be more like Christ's?
