Dear Friends,

This past Friday evening, the last seventy-five of our one hundred fifty four teenagers received the gift of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation. Last week's celebration (Sat. 5/30) was extraordinary. Many of us who have been close to the confirmation program remarked about the numbers of friends and relatives who came. The church was packed. Our confirmation program is a three part preparation. There is instruction, in small group settings, either in the homes or in the Youth Center. In addition, each candidate for confirmation attends a weekend retreat at the Youth Retreat Center in Kearny and finally participates in a group service project. While the teenagers may see these activities as simple tasks that must be accomplished to "qualify" for the sacrament, in fact, they are the paradigm for living the Christian life when gifted with the Holy Spirit. The Spirit gifts us with wisdom, knowledge and understanding to come to know divine things, the working of God in our lives and in our world. We are gifted with piety, the invitation to not just know about God but to enter into an encounter with God in Jesus Christ, to build a relationship with him as brother and friend who walks this journey of life with us. And fortitude gives us the strength to do good, to be the eyes, arms, feet of Christ in the world, as Theresa of Avila has reminded us we are. Instruction, retreat and service. Preparing for the sacrament by living it in anticipation of the gift of the Spirit who strengthens us to live it every day and not just a task to be accomplished. Congrats to our newly confirmed. It was a joy for me to celebrate with you and for you.

This weekend the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord, the *Feast of Corpus Christi*. The Church takes a day out of Ordinary Time to give thanks to her Lord for the gift of HIMSELF in the Eucharistic bread and wine, now changed into His Body and Blood, to strengthen us, to feed us, to walk with us in this journey of life. We are never alone. We never go hungry. Our parish celebrates this great gift with the annual procession of the Blessed Sacrament around the block after the 12:30 Mass. Please join us in this public display of our faith in Christ and in His Real Presence in the Eucharist.

We use this occasion to invite people to consider giving an hour of their time in Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament in the Adoration Chapel. This year, I make a special appeal for increased participation, especially in the overnight hours. It is suggested that there be two adorers for every hour the chapel is opened. Since Covid, we have had a hard time maintaining those

numbers. As you heard last weekend in the witness talks at the end of Mass, time spent with Jesus in the chapel is time well spent, away from the hustle, bustle and noise, the division and the rancor, the violence of life today, outside the reach of social media and everything that comes with it. **Seeking peace in your life? Find it in the quiet of the Chapel with the Lord who speaks softly and listens intently.**

On the usual mundane—have you pledged yet to the Appeal? June 30th is coming quickly. (And don't I know it.)

DEACON BOB LIWANAG’S SPIRITUAL JOURNEY

“I made plans. God laughed and redirected me to His plans.”

Back in October 2010, Deacon Nick Delucca and his wife, Arlene, invited me to become a permanent deacon. I laughed and told them to ask someone else. I was busy with my corporate job, playing golf, and other more important things. Well, this couple’s persistence and patience used prayers to reel me in. I gave in just to make them happy.

I applied to the diaconate program knowing and hoping that I will not be accepted. I received Fr. Ron’s recommendation. My wife, Tessie, approved for me to pursue the diaconate. My three daughters supported my decision.

I went through a year of discernment starting in September 2011 that was filled with doubts rather than confidence. To my huge surprise, I got accepted. I began my formation as a permanent deacon at Seton Hall University’s Immaculate Conception Seminary in September 2012. Four long years of part-time studies in the School of Theology graduate degree program. It was a challenging academic program that tested my faith. My brothers in Christ encouraged me not to give up. By God’s graces, I graduated in May 2016 and ordained on June 4, 2016.

2026 is my 10th year as a permanent deacon. God has rewarded me with a bounty of blessings. My parish responsibilities as a deacon have opened up many spiritual joys. I have learned a lot from Fr. Ron and all the parochial vicars who have served, and are currently serving, at OLMC. Assisting and preaching at Mass brings me closer to Christ. Baptizing children is spiritual joy. The Holy Spirit guides me to comfort grieving families at funerals. Being the OCIA Director, guiding the baptized Christians and non-baptized to Christ and His sacraments, is heavenly. My encounters with parishioners uplift me. In September 2023 Cardinal Joseph Tobin appointed me as the Assistant Director for the Formation of Permanent Deacons in the Archdiocese of Newark. It is an important responsibility to accept and guide future deacons. My marital relationship with Tessie has deepened and flourished.

All of these blessings have come my way because of God’s love for me. That love has transformed me to be more centered on humility, service, and compassion. I’m truly grateful for Jesus Christ’s plan that unfolded through His faithful people to make me His disciple.

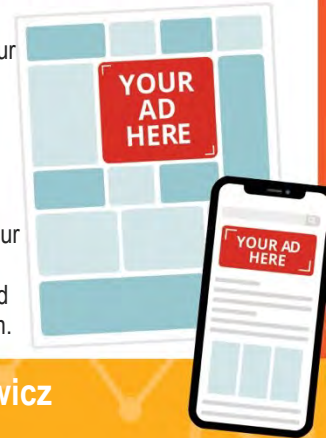

1. Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16

Deuteronomy has a message that continues to inspire: God's love of the faithful, expressed in covenants and proven through history, will continue, as long as the people remain faithful. In his last instruction, Moses warns the people they will need God just as much in the Promised Land as they did in the desert. He reviews God's goodness, deliverance from slavery, guidance through the desert, protection from harm, water from a rock and, most importantly, bread from heaven. From this bread, Israel should have learned to count only on God's word, as the only source of their deliverance.

2. 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Paul's words to the Corinthians (and to us) challenged them to be true to what they did together at worship. Sharing in the one cup (the Blood of Christ) and the one loaf (the Body of Christ) does two things for believers. Jesus' Body in the bread offered mediates salvation to those who receive it as such. In addition, by receiving it, they show themselves to be His Body. United and fed by Jesus, believers go forth into the world, making Christ the center of their lives and the ground for their love for one another.

3. John 6:51-58

The setting for this Eucharistic teaching is not the Last Supper (as it is for the Synoptics and Paul), but the feeding of the five thousand. Here He announces Himself the Bread of Life. Using the vocabulary of chewing and grinding, Jesus declares Himself to be nourishment for the world; His flesh and blood must be eaten and drunk to attain eternal life. He reveals that His ultimate gift to believers is His gift of Self. That gift is compared to and surpasses the manna, with which God fed the Israelites in the desert. And the gift is to continue down through the ages in the Eucharist.

2. How has your life of faith in the Real Presence as the source of your life developed since your First Holy Communion?
3. Do you believe "you are what you eat"?
