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Dear Friends,

Varia – any number of unrelated items.

-As you can see from the cover of the bulletin, our parish school, **the Academy of Our Lady**, celebrated the graduation of the class of 2024 with the *Baccalaureate Mass* on Tuesday evening and the graduation ceremony, itself, the Saturday of this weekend. Going through these events, it's always amazing to me how many of the graduates express similar emotions, the excitement of reaching a real milestone in their lives, coupled with a certain sadness of leaving so many friends as they scatter to different schools for their high school education, and **the real sense of loss of a community of love created and formed by a knowledge of and presence with their God, in Jesus Christ.** These are not just friends. They are like brothers and sisters who have grown tremendously close to one another over the years together. With the confidence in and enthusiasm for the Catholic education the parish provides, each year of graduating classes, I am so happy that we are still able to provide this kind of environment. **God speed** to each and every graduate.

-Next Saturday, June 15th, 160 of Mount Carmel's rising sophomores will be given the gift of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation. They come to this moment, presented by their families, having spent the last year in a program of preparation that included study (in their small group classes), prayer and reflection (especially during their retreats) and service projects (outreach to those in need). While I don't sit in on their classes, I do spend a good deal of time with them during the retreats. I have always been impressed by their honesty and sincerity, even their wonderings about God and His presence in their lives and I am always moved by their willingness to share with each other. This year, because of scheduling conflicts I was unable to attend the sessions at which each group presented their service projects, but Glen tells me those projects included the collection of coats and hoodies for the homeless, toys and games for children hospitalized with cancer, birthday bags for disadvantaged children through the various social service agencies here and in Paterson and drives to lend support to West Bergen Mental Health, the Preston Stott Memorial Scholarship, the Michael Feeney Best Day Ever and food and toiletry drives for the Fr. English Center, Eva's Kitchen, Ridgewood Social Services and Parkside Community Church as well as supplies for Ramapo Bergen Animal Shelter. In all of these projects, your sons and daughters experienced what it is to give of themselves in service, and also learned the sadness and struggles that people deal with every day of their lives. Confirmation is about the empowering by the Spirit to live as witnesses to Jesus in the world and it is an inspiration to see the good works these teenagers are capable of. Each year, those who are preparing for Confirmation fill me with great hope for the future of the Catholic faith community,

but also with an anxiety that we, their families and the parish must find ways to continue to challenge them and help them grow and mature in their faith. I am not so naïve as to believe that this moment will lead to a wholesale “conversion” to a more active and committed living of the faith. We sometimes decry the weakening of faith and participation in Catholic life today. That may be true, but just the fact that these teenagers have continued in their faith formation gives God the chance to touch their lives and deepen their experience of His presence and we should never sell that short. We are all about walking that journey of faith, some faster than others, some straighter than others. Wherever we are on that road, wherever these teens and their families are on that road—it is the same road. Pray every day for them during this week.

During Advent 2024, they'll share their travels to 24 different U.S. states! During Advent 2025 they'll share their travels to 24 different countries!

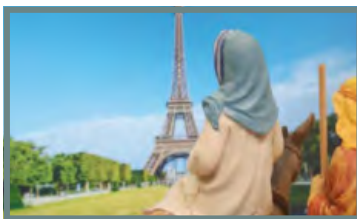
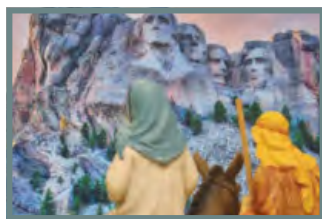

1. Genesis 3:9-15

For the first time in this book, things are not as God commanded. The man and the woman eat from the forbidden tree, and they become subject to the hurtful consequences that God tried to protect them from. Sin comes into the world because God's word is not trusted. It is replaced by the word of another, Satan, the Great Deceiver. They hide from God because they are afraid, even though they had once been comfortable in His presence. And a separation and hostility develop between the man and the woman, as the man blames "the woman whom you put here with me." Rather than admitting his fault, the man seeks to shift the blame to another, a symbol of the estrangement and division between and among humankind. Other hurtful consequences will follow, pain, labor and death.

2. 1 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

Paul's faith assures him that "the one who raised the Lord Jesus" will raise him (Paul) from death to new life. Because we are destined to share eternal life with Christ, everything in this life takes its meaning from that. Paul challenges the Corinthians, and us, to live toward what we are certain about our future and to allow that to permeate our present and interpret our past. Every moment of life, every relationship, every experience, takes on eternal significance in the light of that future.

3. Mark 3:20-35

Returning to Ordinary Time, we resume the Gospel readings from Mark. Today's excerpted passage is a shocking two-part scene from Jesus' life. The first is Mark's description of the reaction of Jesus' family to his ministry, his healing and his teaching. They come to seize him and take him home. Perhaps they feared he would be arrested. Perhaps they were embarrassed by his actions, touching women and lepers, eating with sinners, disregarding pious religious practices. The critical point of this will become obvious later, when his mother and other closer relatives arrive and Jesus announces that ethnic ties don't define the Kingdom. Faith does. The second shocker comes as part of his confrontation with the Scribes. He concludes by teaching there is one sin that will not be forgiven, even though he has come to forgive sin. This unforgiveable sin is the refusal to acknowledge that God is at work in what gives life, heals or frees human beings.
