Dear Friends,

Last week I wrote extensively on the Eucharist in conjunction with the Feast we celebrate this weekend, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord, the Feast of Corpus Christi. This week I want to write (shorter than last week) about the way we celebrate the Eucharist.

You know that Covid dramatically affected our celebration. At first, for three months, it totally cancelled those celebrations. I am grateful to God that we were able to bounce so quickly to virtual celebrations, but even when we were able to celebrate again together there were severe restrictions. Over the course of the years we have been able to return to full celebrations as we knew them before Covid.

But time takes a toll, especially in the “ministers” needed for a complete return to pre-Covid celebrations, including servers, lectors and Eucharistic Ministers. Through so many years of our **Stewardship Renewals**, especially the Ministry Fair, we were always able to recruit new volunteers for these ministries. Without these efforts over these last years we find ourselves in need of all three ministry personnel, servers, lectors and Eucharistic Ministers. We will address the need for servers in the fall, recognizing that summer vacation is about to begin. But I want to put out a call for additional lectors and Eucharistic Ministers. We used to call this a **Ministry Alert**. And so...

MINISTRY ALERT—LECTORS. We are in need of additional lectors, readers, who proclaim the WORD of God at Mass. The first part of the Mass is called the Liturgy of the Word because we believe Christ is present in His word, most especially in the Gospel which is read by the priest, but also in both the 1st and 2nd Readings, proclaimed by a lector. This ministry consists in proclaiming that word and I am asking for members of the congregation to step up to fill these ministries. I know just about everyone in town is familiar with **Jamboree** and **Dad's Night**, productions put on by some very talented parents to benefit the students of Ridgewood. And I know that many in our congregation have had parts in one or both of these productions, which involve getting up in front of large audiences. I especially challenge those who have been part of these productions to use those same talents for the benefit of our community by stepping forward to help us celebrate the Liturgy as it should be celebrated in the ministry of a lector. You have the experience, we could use the talent. Training will be provided and you can choose the specific Mass you attend. Please see that part of this bulletin with the name of the person to contact if you can help. I would be very grateful.

MINISTRY ALERT—EUCHARISTIC MINISTER. The Eucharistic Minister distributes either the consecrated host or the Precious Blood to worshippers who come forward for Holy Communion. It is not a difficult task and one does not have to be a saint to do it. Many may feel they are not worthy for such a ministry. None of us are worthy to either distribute or even to receive Holy Communion. We are all sinners and that is why Jesus gives us His Body and Blood,

to help us grow from sinners into the holy people of God. The Eucharist is given as food for that growth. At each Mass, we need seven Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist in order to distribute Communion under both forms and in a timely manner. That means every weekend we need 42 ministers. That's a considerable number of people but necessary to be able to celebrate the Eucharist in the fullest way possible. **Stewardship** is giving back to God of the many gifts He has given us. What better way to give back to God than to offer the Body and Blood of His Son for a congregation of fellow parishioners who come to His altar to be fed and strengthened. As with the lectors, you will be properly trained. Contact information is available elsewhere in this bulletin and you may choose the Mass that you most frequently attend. We are especially in need of ministers at the Sunday night, 6:30 PM Mass. Be a good Steward of your time and share in this ministry.

On a more material note, you should have received a letter in the mail from me about the **Annual Appeal**. Time is running out to make a pledge that will also help the parish by being eligible for the rebate. Please consider making a pledge of \$100 or \$200, payable over the last six months of the year. But the pledge must be made by June 30 for the parish to receive the rebate. Simply go to the link on the Homepage of the bulletin and it will take you through it. It's that easy.

1. Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16

Deuteronomy has a message that continues to inspire: God's love of the faithful, expressed in covenants and proven through history, will continue, as long as the people remain faithful. In his last instruction, Moses warns the people they will need God just as much in the Promised Land as they did in the desert. He reviews God's goodness, deliverance from slavery, guidance through the desert, protection from harm, water from the rock and, most importantly, bread from heaven. From this bread, Israel should have learned to count only on God's word, as the only source of their deliverance.

2. 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Paul's words to the Corinthians (and to us) challenged them to be true to what they did together at worship. Sharing in the one cup (the Blood of Christ) and the one loaf (the Body of Christ) does two things for believers. Jesus' Body in the bread offered mediates salvation to those who receive it as such. In addition, by receiving it, they show themselves to be His Body. United and fed by Jesus, believers go forth into the world, making Christ the center of their lives and the ground for their love for one another.

3. John 6:51-58

The setting for this Eucharistic teaching is not the Last Supper (as it is for the Synoptics and Paul), but the feeding of the five thousand. Here He announces Himself the Bread of Life. Using the vocabulary of chewing and grinding, Jesus declares Himself to be nourishment for the world; His flesh and blood must be eaten and drunk to attain eternal life. He reveals that His ultimate gift to believers is His gift of Self. That gift is compared to and surpasses the manna, with which God fed the Israelites in the desert. And the gift is to continue down through the ages in the Eucharist.

1. Do you "really" believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharistic bread?
2. How has your life of faith in the Real Presence as the source of your life developed since your First Holy Communion?
3. Do you believe "you are what you eat"?
