First things first—HAPPY FATHER’S DAY to all our Dads. I hope this is a great day for you in every possible way and that your family shows you the love they have for you. May the words expressed in these lines from Robert Louis Stevenson apply to all our parish fathers, and to every man.

and loved much; who has gained the respect of
intelligent men and the love of children;
who has filled his niche and accomplished his task;
who leaves the world better than he found it,
whether by an improved poppy, a perfect poem
or a rescued soul; who never lacked appreciation
of earth’s beauty or failed to express it; who looked for the
best in others and gave the best he had.*

Please accept these pens as a sign of our love and respect for each of you and I challenge you at the same time to let your lives be guided by the inscription on each, *Catholic Fathers Model Their Faith*.

As I have mentioned, the parish has been assigned a deacon for the coming year, a deacon who, with God’s help, will be ordained to the priesthood in May, 2023. He is Rev. Today is the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord, the Feast of Corpus Christi. The Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist is our “sure hope” that we are never alone in this world. What better way to celebrate this Feast than to do so in person and to receive Him Who is the source of our life and well being.

Peace and blessings to you all. Allow me to thank the Director of Missions who has invited us to do a mission appeal in your Parish. I thank Msgr. Ronald, your Pastor, and you all parishioners of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish for your love and generosity. Mindful that the challenges of our time are global, and that you too may have many challenges, I humbly request for your prayers and support.

The Little Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi (LSOSF) were founded in 1923 in Uganda by Mother Mary Kevin Kearney (Servant of God), a Franciscan Missionary Sister from Ireland. Since our founding, the LSOSF Institute has grown and now the sisters witness and do ministry in Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania and a few sisters in the US Mission. There are about 800 members in the LSOSF Institute.

The mission of the LSOSF is to reach out with compassion to the poor and marginalized of our society, following in the footsteps of St. Francis of Assisi and Mother Kevin, our Foundress. The LSOSF serve as educators, in healthcare, and social and pastoral services. Also, the sisters serve among the most marginalized populations, especially the homeless street children, the orphans, people with diverse disabilities, the youth, single mothers, people living with HIV-AIDS, malnourished children, the elderly, and other social issues. In the recent times of the challenging COVID 19 pandemic, our sisters have been reaching out and supporting the poor families and marginalized groups affected by the pandemic and helping the sick people in villages get medical support, distributing masks and hand soap to families in need, providing food and water and other social issues that arise as a result of the current challenges. The impact of Covid-19 has affected our programs for the most vulnerable especially our programs for the vulnerable children we care for in Africa.

I kindly request for your prayers and financial support for our programs, especially for the children we take care of—the orphans, the homeless street children, children with diverse disabilities, young teenage mothers, refugees, and for our feeding programs for the poor, especially the children and single mothers who lack basic necessities of life. 1. Genesis 14:18-20

Through God's help, Abraham has just defeated an enemy that proves invincible to many others. On his return from this victory, he is met by Melchizedek, the priest/king of Salem (Jerusalem), who, in gratitude, prepares a meal for him, to symbolize their special bond. Melchizedek utters words of blessings, to God and to Abraham. Abraham, for his part, offers a tenth of everything to Melchizedek (as priest and representative of God) in gratitude to God for his victory. This priesthood, and its connection to Jerusalem, is fully realized in Jesus, the new and eternal high priest.

2. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Paul reminds the community at Corinth that it is at Eucharist where they would be nearest to Christ and to one another. And this is by God's design. Citing what was handed on to him, he now hands it on to them, that the reality of Jesus' Presence is intimately connected to the reality of His offering. By repeating this ritual the Christian community proclaims this sacrifice until Jesus comes again.

3. Luke 9:11-17

The scene is familiar, a large crowd, distance from both food and shelter, clueless disciples, Jesus Who both cares and teaches. Jesus takes the initiative, after the disciples' initial hesitation. He feeds the hungry and, in doing so, teaches about the kingdom (those who hunger will be filled), about discipleship (only after one offers who one is and what one has can one be used by the Lord to carry on His work), about Who Jesus is (the Son, Who will feed all who come to Him).

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. What impact does the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist have on your life outside the worship setting (the church)? Has your understanding of the Eucharist grown since your First Holy Communion? How?
2. Do you share with others, especially those Catholics who have grown lax in practicing Sunday worship, what the Eucharist means to you?
3. How will you witness to Jesus both in your actions and with your words as you live this day with your family?
