Dear Friends,

Once again, before the June 30th deadline, I write to you on the **Annual Appeal** of the Archdiocese, most especially to those who have not committed. First, I ask you to check out my video message on the homepage of our website. It has the pitch I gave on Pledge Sunday. A little history. The Archdiocese owns the property on which the former parish of St. Lucy's was located in downtown Jersey City. Several of its buildings were being rented to Catholic Charities (for \$1.00 a year) for use as shelters, different buildings for homeless people in different life-circumstances; e.g., men with HIV, homeless families, etc. The City of Jersey City was interested in developing this last area of the downtown, closest to the Hoboken border. Working with the City, a deal was worked out with the developer who would build a brand new shelter for Catholic Charities but then the rest of the property would be a high rise residential building. To facilitate this project, the Archdiocese donated the property (with a market value of somewhere between eleven and fourteen million dollars. That is a considerable commitment to "doing good." That shelter, a picture of which is contained in the video, should be dedicated sometime in July, when the schedules of the Cardinal and the Mayor of Jersey City can be coordinated. In addition to that extraordinary gift, the Archdiocese gives over 2.3 million dollars a year in subsidy to Catholic Charities, for all their programs, including the homeless shelter program who's operating deficit for the next fiscal year is expected to run over 1.1 million dollars. I know this first hand because I sit on the Finance Committee of Catholic Charities and we just adopted our budget for the next fiscal year. While things are getting better in terms of grants, government contracts and fund raising, this subsidy is still an important part in fulfilling our Mission.

I mention these details because sometimes we think of the Archdiocese as the "big bad wolf." I hope this last paragraph dispels that a little. When you make a pledge to the **Annual Appeal**, it is a pledge to help **people**, the homeless, the mentally and physically challenged, the hungry, faithful priests in retirement, future priests who need to be trained and countless other Catholics who need to be formed, educated and served. The **Appeal** does all of these things. It is a charity worthy of a gift.

A second reason for giving is the help the parish gets from the **Appeal**. 50% of the dollars over goal are returned to the parish as a rebate. Last year it was 100% and the parish received approximately \$167,000. toward our own budget. This year it is 50%, the level at which it was before Covid. Of course I would have liked the full 100%, but I can't argue with the reasoning of the Archdiocese. The 50% that goes back to it will be placed in a special fund to help subsidize poorer parishes that are struggling to serve the needs of their parishioners. In these days of rising costs, energy and insurance bills, more and more parishes are struggling with their expenses and loss of revenue. I know this fund will help them "stay afloat." But our budget will

take a hit of about \$80,000 unless we can increase the number of donors and gifts **before June 30, 2023**. All money received by December 31—from pledges made before June 30—will be eligible for the rebate. That's why I keep stressing the need to make a pledge within the next 6 days.

If you have not committed yet, please help us help those in need, and help ourselves, especially if you believe we're working to make this parish all that it can be as the presence of Christ in our world. Make a pledge of \$100 or \$200, payable over the last six months of this calendar year (that's \$16.66 or \$33.33 per month, respectively). The easiest way is to go to the bottom of the Homepage on the website and click on the link to the **Annual Appeal**. I thank you for your patience with me in these last weeks on the Appeal but it is important to us. I won't mention it again and the video will come down on June 30, 2023.

On two priests who will be visiting Mount Carmel. This weekend Fr. Gilbert Omolo, a Passionist missionary, will be visiting Mount Carmel as part of the Cooperative Mission Appeal. As was noted, the Appeal was established to provide the opportunity for a Mission Society to ask for help in all the parishes of our country without overburdening those same parishes with multiple requests. So, each parish is asked to welcome one missionary a year to make his pitch. Fr. Gilbert's appeal will be on their missions in Kenya. A second collection will be held immediately after the first and you may make donations directly to the rectory in the week that follows. Checks should be made out to Mount Carmel with "Mission Appeal" on the memo line. Thank you, in advance, for your generosity.

I am happy to welcome back Fr. Felix Ugwuozor, a priest of the Diocese of Enugu, Nigeria, who will be helping out for the extended summer. He is a lecturer at the University of Nigeria and heads the **OneHopeChildren Foundation**, bringing hope to the people of Nigeria, especially the children. He is a past faculty member at Montclair State University. This is his third summer with us here at Mount Carmel. He arrives at the end of this month. I am sure you will welcome him warmly, as you always do.

Last, but not least. As is my custom, this will be my last regular column through July and August. From time to time I will write, when I think I have something to say (although you may disagree that it was worthwhile), but certainly not as long as they have become over these last months (too much to say, you may want to add). In any case my prayer for all our families is a safe, relaxing or exciting (whichever you prefer) summer with the people you love the most.

1. **Jeremiah 20:10-13**

This passage comes on the heels of an account in which Jeremiah is scourged and placed in the stocks at the order of the priest Pashur. This experience is the occasion for the inner dialogue represented in this excerpt. Feeling betrayed by those he thought were friends, Jeremiah makes his case before God in the style of a lament. Holding nothing back, he complains about the untenable situation he finds himself in. And yet, the complaint is matched by an expression of his ultimate trust in God. Candid about this inner struggle, the prophet remains God's loyal servant.

2. **Romans 5:12-15**

The author looks around him and sees Adam's sin as just the beginning of a whole history of sin. The violence, the inhumanity, the injustice have a stranglehold on the world; all the result of Adam's sin, ultimately leading to his death and to the death of all human beings. And to the spiritual death which is estrangement from God. But Paul will not let the reader wallow in this horror for Jesus Christ, the gracious gift of God is the antitype of Adam, bringing life and salvation to the world. Through His saving death and resurrection, Jesus has provided access to God and graced us with a strength that can lift us above every evil.

3. **Matthew 10:26-33**

In the example of the sparrows, in conjunction with the three commands against fear, Jesus reassures the believer of the attentive love and caring of God. The reassurance specifically targets any fear the believer may have in both living in the light and proclaiming the good news "from the housetops." Three reasons are offered for this reassurance: (1) imminent judgment will reveal all truth, (2) even in the face of bodily harm, no one can destroy the inner person, (3) valued by God, God will care for Jesus' followers. Those who accept Jesus as Son of God will be strengthened in fidelity and will be rewarded for it.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. What are some of the fears you deal with in your life? What would it be like to live without "fear"?
2. Do you really believe that God knows you in such an intimate way as to count every hair on your head? If so, what does that have to say to you about the fears you just identified?
3. Do you think of yourself as a courageous disciple of Christ? Why?
