Dear Friends,

As I write this on June 30th, I can still use the above title. (At least this one time I'm happy the bulletin has to be in early).

THANK YOU! THANK YOU! THANK YOU!

Those are the only words I can say in response to Sunday's celebration. It will always be for me the most outstanding liturgical moment in my entire priesthood, including my first mass, more than fifty-five years ago. The congregation/community, the priests/deacon, the liturgical ministers, the music, the spirit—every aspect of the liturgy fulfilled the words of the opening hymn—*Come, now is the time to worship. Come, now is the time to give your heart.* I really felt a community giving its heart to the Lord in praise and thanksgiving, maybe a little bit for me, but mostly for and to Him, Jesus the Lord, for all the ways that He has helped this community grow—**together**. A number of people involved in the life of the parish commented to me how inspiring it was to see people from all the different “charisms” coming together in worship, from the Neocatechumenal Way, Cornerstone, Perpetual Adoration, ChristLife, the Spanish Community, the Youth Group, the choirs—whichever road on which they are travelling with the Lord to find, in the Lord and in the community—strength, support and brotherhood/sisterhood. Though, for me, it was the source of great anxiety in preparation, it was a great inspiration in celebration.

A deeply felt **THANK YOU** to all who helped plan, prepare for, manage, (if that's the correct word), and clean up afterward, this very special moment in my life. I am forever grateful. I know when you single out special individuals you run the risk of leaving someone out. But in this case, I need to acknowledge at least one person by name, Joanne Archer. You know how many times in the past I almost retired. Each time, Joanne was always ready to pick up the challenge, and finally did. And you also know I truly tried to avoid such a celebration. But she persisted. And as I said above, it was the most meaningful Eucharist I have ever been privileged to preside at. I will try to get a list of all who served and write individually to each one over the summer. (I'm told that was about 160) And I will certainly, personally acknowledge every card and gift. Please be patient with me if it takes a few months, because I want to do it myself.

And an apology—to all those I didn't get to greet during the reception because there were just so many there. And an apology to all those I did get to greet for “seconds” only because my “handlers” wouldn't let me linger. I wish it could have been different but I realize what an

impossible task it was. But since I'll be around a little longer, I hope I can make up for that.

And speaking of "being around a little longer," let me explain what has happened. I received a call from the Cardinal on Saturday, June 20th just to let me know they were still working on a replacement. On Wednesday, June 24th, I received another call from the Cardinal, from Rome, during which he told me that Msgr. Robert Emery, current pastor of St. Aloysius, Caldwell, would be the new pastor of Mount Carmel. (If you want to know something about him, go to their website. They have a biography on him posted there.) But during the same call he told me that Msgr. Emery would not be able to begin until September 1, and would I accept being Temporary Administrator for July and August, or should they look for someone else. Since it made no sense to me to bring in someone else (either fulltime or part-time) for only two months I agreed. But I will also be helping out at St. Gabe's, because I committed to that to Fr. Frank. So I'll be doing a bit of "commuting" back and forth. Until sometime the week of July 23, I will continue to live here and help out at St. Gabe's with Masses. By the end of that week I will move to St. Gabriel's to allow the new pastor to fix up my rooms. (They haven't been touched, painting, carpeting, etc. in 29 years.) I'll commute here for Masses and whatever other sacramental celebrations need to be covered. I hope this makes some sense to you.

Finally, I want to close with the last lines of my homily on Sunday. At the end of that homily I quoted a line from a message a parishioner had sent me. "Perhaps my perception is wrong but I see **us** as having grown so in remarkable ways these 29 years." The emphasis on the **us** is my take. That we all have grown together, in the Lord and with the Lord is the most important reality, or should be the most important reality/goal of anyone in pastoral ministry. Because **in the Lord and with the Lord**, all things are possible. You, my dear friends (that's how I have always begun my column), have that grace/power within you, as individuals and as a community, to continue that journey. No pastor could leave his beloved community with more conviction than I that you will.

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



TODAY'S READINGS

1. Zechariah 9:9-10

The second half (9-14) of the Book of Zechariah, from which today's passage is excerpted, reflects the continuing hope of the prophet and his post-exilic contemporaries for a restored Judah under the leadership of an ideal king. This restored relationship is evident in the fact that God addresses Jerusalem as "daughter." And in this restored relationship, Jerusalem will see her king seated on an ass (not a horse, associated with war), associated with peace, a peace which will extend beyond her borders to the whole world.

2. Romans 8:9, 11-13

Baptism brought the Spirit of God (the Father) and of Christ into our lives. That Spirit penetrates and inspires every aspect of who we are and what we do, with our hearts open to God. The power of God to create life, where once there was death, physical and spiritual, is given to those who are open to this Spirit. Because of this, we owe nothing to the flesh and are able to put to death the tendency to all fall into sin.

3. Matthew 11:25-30

The tone and content that runs through these verses is that of wisdom, after which we believers are to seek. In the Synoptic Gospels, Jesus is portrayed as a wisdom teacher and this excerpt is an example of that. Jesus is portrayed as sharing an intimate relationship with God, one based on a mutual knowledge. Since Jesus is wisdom incarnate, it follows that He is the source of wisdom for those who seek Him. This wisdom reflects the revelation of God, which provides guidance for those who follow Him, and it is not a burden for Jesus is with them and for them.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Do you live your ordinary everyday faith in an extraordinary way? How do you do this?
2. On this journey of life, what are the struggles you face that are hard to carry?
3. Is Jesus giving you the rest you need for your struggles?
