Other times by pre-arranged appt. with a priest. Communal Penance celebrations (with individual confessions) are celebrated in Advent and Lent and will be announced.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who wish to enter the Catholic faith and Catholics who wish to complete the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are most welcome to begin the journey at any time. Call the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

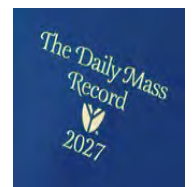

1. Isaiah 55:10-11

2nd Isaiah is the author of the middle chapters of the Book of Isaiah. Writing two centuries after the original prophet, he has already seen Isaiah's predictions come true. The people are in exile, brought low by a foreign power. Some believe God to be powerless, but others recognize their own sinfulness as the reason for their state. The prophet speaks to both, offering a vision of deliverance and restoration. He concludes these chapters with today's reassuring promise—God will be God, His word will find fertile ground and transform His people and the world.

2. Romans 8:18-23

Human creation and non-human creation are tied together in a tragic but hopeful future and both suffer because of humankind's fall. Each of us carry within ourselves, in our own body, a part of the created world that is groaning in labor pains, as we, and the world, await the sovereign rule of Jesus, begun on the cross, but only fully realized in the new world, inaugurated at His return. Until then, the first fruits of the Spirit have been given to us as we await the coming of that day.

3. Matthew 13:1-23

The overriding purpose of this excerpt is an explanation by Matthew why so few of his co-religionists accepted Jesus' invitation. The excerpt can easily be divided into three parts; (1) the parable, in which Jesus encourages his disciples to understand that while their task is to sow, they cannot create the harvest, this must be left to God. (2) Why does Jesus teach in parables? In this second part, Matthew wants us to see Jesus in the same prophetic line as Isaiah, who was told his preaching would be rejected because of the hardness of heart of the nation. (3) The interpretation of the parable stresses the different kinds of soil into which the seed falls, Matthew stressing to his communities their need to be open to the word that it may grow in them.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. As Paul reflects, what is the glory yet to be born in you?
2. In these days of division, violence and civil and political discord, what word of God has taken root in your life?
3. What do you do or what can you do to cultivate that word in your life?
