SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (Confessions)

Saturday 1:00pm-2:00pm & Monday 7:00pm-7:30pm (Sept-May)
Other times by pre-arranged appt. with a priest. Communal Penance celebrations (with individual confessions) are celebrated in Advent and Lent and will be announced.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who wish to enter the Catholic faith and Catholics who wish to complete the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are most welcome to begin the journey at any time. Call the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

Dear Friends,

A short word to say—hello. I hope everyone is enjoying their summer. If you like the heat, you certainly are. Even though we may be headed for a drought, I must say I have enjoyed the beautiful days, even with the heat and humidity.

I said I would only write to keep you informed about developments in and around the parish, and this is one of those moments, especially since I will leave on the 22nd for ten days up to my place in Pa. to do a different kind of work.

As I write this, at 8:30AM on Wednesday, 8/10, I just received a text that the section of the restored pews which were to have been re-installed today is now delayed until tomorrow because of transportation issues. So I am writing this on the blind, so to speak, to say that by the time you read this over the weekend you will have noticed that another section of the church is now complete, (I hope). If this, in fact, happens. That will leave only one main section left, the front, pulpit side. This section is scheduled to be removed on Thursday, 8/18, with the floor being started on Friday, 8/19. It is my hope that the church itself will be completely finished within the first two weeks of September. There may be some odds and ends left, like the pews in the choir loft and the daily mass chapel which can be done without much disruption. Hopefully the floors at the side entrances will also be completed at that time.

During the next few weeks, the bathroom off the cry room will be totally renovated which will require its closure and the use of the bathrooms in the parish center. I'm sorry for the inconvenience of having to go downstairs but the bathroom is in need of a complete updating. This project will probably take about two weeks. The remaining projects after all these are the water infiltration of the front façade of the church and the replacement of the cracked lintels over several of the side entrances and then the repainting of the church interior which was done almost thirty years ago. I would hope all of these would be finished by the holidays.

I'm sure you've seen the blurbs in the bulletin about two important "drives." One is for back-to-school supplies, run by a Ridgewood High student to help the SSA provide needed school supplies for students. This is a drive started by a couple of students a number of years ago and taken over by others as students eventually "age out." It is an important help for those in need. Please read the info at another place in this bulletin. The second important "drive" is the monthly food drive conducted by our Youth Ministry. Sometimes we might forget that as much as everyone has been hurt by the inflation crisis, it

is those on fixed incomes who struggle the most. The food drive is next Saturday and more info can be found elsewhere in this bulletin.

Lastly, the annual Block Party. It is a week later this year than it has been. By that time the majority of the work in the church will be finished and it will seem like a brand new building... I'm hoping we can make this weekend, Sept. 17/18, our **LET'S GET BACK TOGETHER AGAIN** weekend. We all know Covid is still around, although on the decline and that it will be around for some time. Everyone needs to come up with their own "modus operandi," "way of acting," in the face of this reality. I invite everyone to reflect on this in the coming weeks and think of 9/18 as their **RE-START**, returning to in-pew worship, coming to the Block Party and re-engaging with the parish. This is not a formal program or a massive ad campaign. Just a simple **INVITE**. As they used to say on the old *Beverly Hillbillies* program (if anyone still remembers), "**Y'all COME BACK NOW, YA HEAR.**"

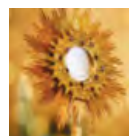

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



TODAY'S READINGS

1. Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

As with other prophets, Jeremiah announces, in the early chapters of this book, that if the people listen, God's blessings would flow for them; but if not, disaster would befall the kingdom. The people and their leaders failed to heed the warnings and suffer the consequences. But the prophet, too, suffers. For advising to surrender to the Babylonians, Jeremiah is thrown into a cistern, expecting death, but is saved by a court official who respects Jeremiah's prophetic call. Through it all, Jeremiah never doubts God's presence and concern.

2. Hebrews 12:1-4

The author of this letter uses the metaphor of a relay race. His readers should understand themselves as the final runners, who have been preceded by a great number of witnesses (such as those mentioned in the previous chapter, the excerpt from last week). They have crossed the finish line and await those yet to come. Though the race is long, these last runners can remain strong and committed by keeping their eyes fixed on Jesus.

3. Luke 12:49-53

Fire is a repeated image of judgment in Luke's Gospel, and Jesus' baptism an illusion to His own death. In this excerpted passage, He once again reminds His followers that his ministry is pointing to Jerusalem, and His death. But not just for Him. All those who hear Him will also have to undergo the strains of discipleship. This is no feel-good, upbeat, motivational self-help gimmick. All who choose to follow Him must know the seriousness of that decision; it will lead to peace and new life, but only through the cross.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Should faith cost the believer something? Anything? Or does the gospel of prosperity sound better?
2. Have you ever experienced discord in your family, neighborhood, work place, social gatherings because of Jesus or Gospel values?
3. How can you challenge others with Christ's words and example?
