Communal Baptisms are held every month on the first Sunday at 1:30pm and on the third Saturday at 11:00am (with some exceptions). Register a month or two in advance for the Baptismal Program.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (Confessions)

Saturday 1:00pm-2:00pm & Monday 7:00pm-7:30pm (Sept-May)
Other times by pre-arranged appt. with a priest. Communal Penance celebrations (with individual confessions) are celebrated in Advent and Lent and will be announced.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who wish to enter the Catholic faith and Catholics who wish to complete the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are most welcome to begin the journey at any time. Call the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

Dear Friends,

I hope you had the opportunity last Sunday to stop by the Block Party. Even with the difficulty in finding parking, it was every bit worth the effort. Unfortunately, because of the crowds, we did run out of some foods, but, overall, it was a great success and everyone seemed to have a great time. From the perspective of those who “manned” the Dunk Tank, myself, Fr. Anthony, Deacon Bob Liwanag, the kids certainly enjoyed themselves. I think they set a record for the number of times we got dunked. Some have even suggested that the Block Party leadership rigged the tank to ensure that happened. In any case, because the weather was so beautiful, the cool water was a welcome refresher.

Speaking of the “leadership” of the event, I want to thank all who helped make it such a special day, especially Jeff Voigt, who served as General Chair and Cathy Hunt who rounded up so many volunteers to staff the many games we had this year. But the thanks really go to everyone who worked: those who set up, those who cooked and served the food, those who ran the games and those who cleaned up. In total, a big effort and a lot of generous people who **all** made it possible.

This coming Friday, we begin the series of **House Gatherings**. I wrote about the general purpose of these gatherings in my column for the September 11th bulletin, which you could read again on-line. But I wanted to add another thought. TODAY'S READINGS

1. Amos 6:1, 4-7

Amos was the 8th Century B.C., prophet of the southern kingdom (Judah), sent by God to prophesy in the northern kingdom (Israel), where he was decidedly unpopular (imagine an Iranian prophesying here). His message—the self-absorption of the people, evidenced by their sumptuous banquets, celebrated with wine and song, on luxurious couches, will only lead to disaster, for themselves, first, and for the entire kingdom.

2. I Timothy 6:11-16

In the previous verses, Paul warns against false teachers, who even expect a fee for their dubious service. Today's excerpted section encourages Timothy to be an example and a model for others to follow, following the example of Jesus, Himself, as one who dedicates himself to God and practices every virtue, so as to look forward to his reward, not here, in monetary payment, but in the final appearance of Jesus.

3. Luke 16:19-31

Following last week's example of the unjust and wily steward, Luke continues on the theme of the pursuit of riches. In the story of the rich man and Lazarus, only a gate separates the vastly different worlds, one of fine linen and sumptuous dining, the other of poverty, hunger and disease. Just as they were separated in life, so shall they be separated in death, but this time by a wide chasm. The reversal, torment for the one, but now honor for the other, reflects an inescapable truth—how one lives in this world determines how one will live in the next. Any changes needed must happen in the here and now.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Is there a Lazarus at your front door?
2. Are there any ways by which our community (religious and civic) could become more conscious of the poor, hungry and homeless around us?
3. A famous Holocaust survivor has written, "The opposite of love is not hate, it's indifference." How does that resonate with you?
