Dear Friends,

This will be my last word on **We are His Witnesses**, at least until next year. Not because we've completed the process. Not because we've bailed on the process. Simply because with the Advent/Christmas season coming, it's time to focus on the incarnate God, who comes to us as a baby, someone small, so that we might not be afraid to approach, to encounter the immensity of the maker of the whole universe in the outstretched arms of a defenseless baby. It's time to focus on Him, about, to and for Whom **We Are His Witnesses**. May this Advent/Christmas be a time when we discover Him again and I will do my best to keep this in focus for the next two months.

Thank you to all who participated in the Listening Sessions. We had the largest number of all the parishes in the Archdiocese who have held their Listening Sessions so far. I'm grateful to Jake Krempel and Kristin Halvey for their leadership in this process and to all who acted as facilitators and scribes for these sessions. Your time and talent are greatly appreciated.

As you can see from the front of this bulletin, this is the **Academy of Our Lady Weekend**. Each year, we take the time to remind the parish that we do have a parochial school, which we co-sponsor with St. Catharine's. The whole purpose of the school is to provide a place Christ is "encountered," faith is formed and Christian community is celebrated. Students from the Academy will be fulfilling ministry roles in the celebrations of the Eucharist this weekend and, as always, I ask your consideration for your support of the Academy through a contribution/pledge to the annual appeal, now called the **Legacy Campaign**. Envelopes are in the pews this weekend.

And speaking of "encountering" Christ, a word about a practice of the communities of the **Neocatechumenal Way**. At a certain point in the life of each community of **The Way**, the members of a community go door-to-door, announcing the "good news" that God loves you. They're not selling anything. They're not registering you. They're not even inviting you to Mass or to some special event. They simply want to share the news with you that you are loved by God. You can invite them in; you can say thank you and close the door. You can ignore your bell or the knock at your door. The response is yours. I just wanted you to know they do this with my blessing and the permission of the civil authorities.

Finally, FYI, you may have heard or questioned about the school gym. A couple of weeks ago, on a Thursday night when the building was closed, there was a partial ceiling collapse in the gym. After the clean-up, which included a total wash-down of all surfaces because of the dust, an engineering firm was called in to assess the condition of the remaining ceiling. The conclusion of the evaluation is that the remaining ceiling needs to be demolished but the safety of those using the gym at this time could not be guaranteed.

For the safety of all, the gym is closed until further notice. We are moving as quickly as possible to replace the ceiling. Sorry for this disruption but the building is almost a 100 years old.

There is a **\$92K gap** between Academy's tuition revenue and education costs. The school's needs are met through donations, from both current parents and this campaign.

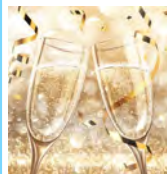

TODAY'S READINGS

1. Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

By the time Ezekiel records his vision, the Temple of Solomon, for four hundred years the focus of Jewish worship, has been destroyed by the Babylonians, an event predicted by the prophet in earlier chapters, the consequence of God withdrawing His presence because of the unfaithfulness of the people. Now the glory of God has returned and in the vision Ezekiel sees a new Temple, grander than Solomon's, depicting an ideal age when the bond between God and people will be strong. In words that recall the Genesis account of Eden, the restoration envisions the Temple as the source of life for this kingdom, the place where God alone is worshipped.

2. 1 Corinthians 3:9-11, 16-17

Having once worshipped at the Temple in Jerusalem, Paul, after his conversion, comes to realize that the Christian community, itself, is God's temple, His building, where the Holy Spirit dwells. This living temple has Jesus, Himself, as its foundation and anyone who seeks to destroy it will not only fail, but brings destruction on himself/herself.

3. John 2:13-22

Unlike the synoptics, for whom the cleaning of the Temple took place in the final week of Jesus' life, John places it in the beginning as a prophetic inauguration of the ministry of Jesus Who, in His own words, will become the new temple. The buying and selling and exchange of coins were for the convenience of the pilgrims. Jesus' real criticism was that the "business" of religion had replaced the "spiritual power" of being the place where the living God encounters His people. Jesus, through His own Body, will become the new Temple where that encounter takes place. Even the disciples do not understand this, until after the Resurrection.

1. Which of the images about God's temple speaks to you about your relationship with the sacred?
2. In what ways do you feel the living waters flowing into your life? Or do you?
3. Does your religious practice open your eyes and heart to God's presence in the world?
