SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

Dear Friends,

As you read this, I will be in the Mission in the Turks and Caicos Islands, celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation. As I mentioned last week, I feel like I have been away more than usual this fall and so I am really looking forward to my return and the next four or five months without so much travel.

Next weekend we celebrate the annual **Academy of Our Lady Weekend**. **Even though these words are very repetitive, it needs to be said over and over again.** As we list the principal among parish staff in the bulletin, I have always reminded the parish that we do have a parochial school, even if it's not on our property. Over the years, many of our parish families have recognized the value of our **Parochial** school. As I have noted in the past, it is accredited by **Middle States** and is a United States Department of Education recognized **Blue Ribbon School**, recognizing the academic excellence achieved by its students. The **Blue Ribbon School** designation is a sought-after recognition, not just by Catholic Schools but by public schools as well. As I said, it is a recognition of academic excellence. **The Academy** reopened for full time, in-person class the September after the lockdown and has remained open ever since, with the exception of the planned closings immediately after the extended vacations. But the real reason for the existence of the **Academy** is, and always will be, what Catholic education is all about—an instrument for the formation and education of our children in the Catholic faith. It fulfills the objective of the *Parish Mission Statement* that appears weekly on the front cover of the bulletin, believing in Jesus Christ, embracing His teaching to be the light of the world—into the future. The heart of the school, and we make no bones about it or apologies for it, is faith formation—a solid grounding in the beliefs of Catholicism, lived out in a community of love, respect and joy. God, Jesus Christ, religion and values are very much a part of the daily life of the students, in instruction, in atmosphere and in the personal relationships between teachers and students and students and students. Catholic schools began because the public schools of the time were so closely influenced by a Protestant ethic and culture that the faith of Catholic students was threatened by that closeness. Today, it is not so much another religious identity that threatens the faith of Catholic children but rather the secular environment and culture that threatens our children and the fact that parental rights seem to stop at the schoolhouse door.

This year, our celebration has taken on a new look. All the masses (with the exception of the 3:00PM) will have students from the school in one or another of the liturgical ministries and in hospitality and welcome. In addition, “coffee and” will be served in the Parish Center after the 9:30 and the 11:00, where more information will be available and where families who might be interested in the

school can meet and talk with the school families who will be present, an opportunity to hear, first hand, what the Academy offers. A video will be shown both in church, between masses, and down in the Parish Center. All are invited downstairs after these two masses, not just families with children.

This brings me to a familiar part of the weekend, the **Annual Fund**. Beyond tuition and the subsidy support that comes directly from the Archdiocese, additional resources are needed to keep the school flourishing. Some of these resources come from the fundraising of the Home and School Association and from the Fathers' Guild. But an important part is this **Annual Fund**. Each year I ask each and every one of our parish households (including myself) to pledge one hundred dollars, either as a single gift or a monthly payment for the next four months, to help us continue to make this important way of providing Catholic formation available for future generations. At \$25 a month, it is an investment in the future of the Catholic community that is certainly worth it. Please join me in this crusade for the Church of the future. Envelopes will be in the pews throughout the church. During the coming week, I ask you to think about the possibility of being part of this effort to keep Catholic school education available for any family who wishes it. Of course, larger donations are always welcome.

TODAY'S READINGS

1. 1 Kings 17:10-16

Elijah's mission was to win from the royal house of King Ahab an acknowledgement of God as true King of Israel. As long as Ahab proceeded as if he were not accountable to God, he would risk bringing down heavenly judgment, as in the case of the drought Elijah brought down on the kingdom. Journeying to Sidon, the homeland of Ahab's wicked Queen Jezebel (where there is also drought and famine, as a sign their gods are powerless in the face of Israel's God), Elijah turns to a poor widow for support. Meeting Elijah's needs and believing in his assurance of God's care, her trust is rewarded as God provides for her, her son and the prophet. If only Ahab would do the same.

2. Hebrews 9:24-28

The author describes Jesus' sacrifice against the background of the celebration of the *Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur*. Unlike the High Priest, Jesus enters the sanctuary, the Holy of Holies, with His own blood (shed on the Cross), not the blood of goats. Because of the value of His sacrifice, He enters but once, not year-by-year, as the High Priest. Having taken away sin, by His sacrifice, when He comes in glory it will be to lead those who believe in Him to salvation.

3. Mark 12:38-44

Mark places this episode near the end of Jesus' earthly life. It raises the question: who really serves God—the religious leaders, the rich, or a simple and poor widow? Among the first group, Jesus continues his constant confrontation with hypocrisy, as opposed to authentic discipleship. What are the signs of the former? Public displays, public recognition, special honors. For the second group, the value of the gift is not measured by its quantity but by the interior service to God it symbolizes.

2. Have you ever experienced "poor" people as freer and more generous?
3. Would you call yourself generous? Why? Do you trust the Lord will provide?

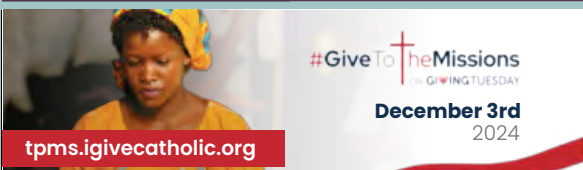
