Dear Friends,

Two weeks ago I mentioned the cruise I would be on when you read that Sunday's bulletin. It was a great time, plenty of rest, relaxation and sunshine. I am grateful it was not this most recent past week because it appears from the forecasts hurricane Nicole would have been a constant "companion on the journey," and an unwanted one at that. I'm grateful to the staff, and especially, Fr. Anthony, for holding down the fort, especially in light of Fr. Frank's unanticipated illness (of which he's recovered). But the real reason I bring this up is something I observed on the cruise. We were told the ship was full which, according to its website, that means 4,180 passengers. What struck me was the uninhibited freedom of movement and action these passengers exhibited. Whether on the elevators, the lounges, the dining rooms, in fact, throughout the whole ship, very few wore masks or shied away from contact with others, most of whom would have been strangers. Without wanting to "bite my tongue" sometime down the line, it appeared that everyone acted as if the pandemic was over. Certainly there was no hesitation in engaging with other people. I hope that's the sign of both the present and things to come.

Speaking of things to come, next weekend is the 19<sup>th</sup> annual **Academy of Our Lady Weekend**. As we list the principal among parish staff in the bulletin, I have always reminded the parish that we do have a parochial school, even if it's not on our property. Over the years, many of our parish families have recognized the value of our **Parochial** school. As I have noted in the past, it is accredited by **Middle States** and is a United States Department of Education recognized **Blue Ribbon School**, recognizing the academic excellence achieved by its students. It re-opened for full time, in-person class the September after the lockdown and has remained open ever since, with the exception of the planned closings immediately after the extended vacations. But the real reason for the existence of the **Academy** is, and remains, what Catholic education is all about—an instrument for the formation and education of our children in the Catholic faith. It fulfills the objective of the *Parish Mission Statement* that appears weekly on the front cover of the bulletin, believing in Jesus Christ, embracing his teaching to be the light of the world—into the future. The heart of the school, and we make no bones about it or apologies for it, is faith formation—a solid grounding in the beliefs of Catholicism, lived out in a community of love, respect and joy. God, Jesus Christ, religion and values are very much a part of the daily life of the students, in instruction, in atmosphere and in the personal relationships between teachers and students and students and students.

This brings me to another part of the weekend, the **Annual Fund**. Beyond tuition and the subsidy support that comes directly from the Archdiocese, additional resources are needed to keep the school flourishing. Some of these resources come from the fundraising of the Home and School Association and from the Fathers' Guild. But another important part is this **Annual Fund**. Each year I

ask each and every one of our parish households (including myself) to pledge one hundred dollars, either as a single gift or a monthly payment for the next four months, to help us continue to make this important way of providing Catholic formation available for future generations. At \$25. a month, it is an investment in the future of the Catholic community that is certainly worth it. Please join me in this crusade for the Church of the future. Envelopes are available in the pews throughout the church. Please fill one out, put it in the boxes at all the doors, mail them to the rectory or directly to the school.

Also on the horizon is our annual Thanksgiving Day Mass, with the distribution of blessed bread to be shared at your Thanksgiving table. Given the return to a near normal experience of living, I think we have a lot to be thankful for. What better way to start the day than with an acknowledgement of God's goodness to us in so many ways and to share the grace of that moment at our tables later in the day. Join us for our celebration of thankfulness on Thanksgiving morning at 8:30 AM.

### 1. **Malachi 3:19-20**

This prophet (whose name means “my messenger”) ministered after the exile. Though engaged (at least outwardly) in the holy effort to rebuild the temple destroyed by the Babylonians, these people were inwardly far from God, complaining that there was little to gain from serving Him. Malachi announces that they are wrong and he warns the proud and the wicked that a judgment awaits them. For them, a blazing fire awaits, consuming even the roots. But for the just, it will be like the dawn of a new day, when the sun shall rise and shine on them with its healing warmth.

### 2. **2 Thessalonians 3:7-12**

In today’s excerpted reading, the author issues some very practical guidelines for living. Don’t burden the community with your piety. You may be “waiting for the Lord” but in the meantime you need to continue daily living, go to work, earn your keep, mind your business. And the number one example of all of this is the author himself. Paul points to his own lifestyle as the example to be followed in waiting for the Lord’s return. Waiting for the Lord cannot be an excuse for shirking one’s responsibilities.

### 3. **Luke 21:5-19**

The subject matter of this passage is the destruction of the Jerusalem Temple. It was commonly believed that that event would mark the beginning of the end, and the return of Jesus in glory. Writing after this destruction, Luke realizes that the end may not come as soon as expected and prepares the community for the struggles that lie ahead. The catastrophes and tragedies of human life, wars, persecutions, natural disasters, will continue and these events call for bold witness on the part of each Christian, a witness Jesus promises that will depend not on an individual’s strength but on the strength of the Lord, Himself.

### REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. What does the reading from 2 Thessalonians have to say about complacency in living one’s faith?
2. Jesus speaks about endurance and perseverance. These last almost three years of the pandemic have tested that endurance and perseverance. How did you do? Where was God in these moments for you?
3. In a hostile environment, have I ever given testimony on behalf of Jesus?

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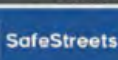


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
