SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (Confessions)

Saturday 1:00pm-2:00pm
Other times by pre-arranged appt. with a priest. Communal Penance celebrations (with individual confessions) are celebrated in Advent and Lent and will be announced.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who wish to enter the Catholic faith and Catholics who wish to complete the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are most welcome to begin the journey at any time. Call the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

Dear Friends,

Today the Church celebrates the *Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe* (the official title). It is also the last Sunday of the Church's liturgical year.

As feasts go, *Christ the King* (the more common title) is really a late-comer. It was first celebrated on October 31, 1926, having been inaugurated by Pope Pius XI in *Quas Primas*, the encyclical letter closing the Holy Year, 1925. That Holy Year was dedicated to two themes, the Missionary Activity of the Church and World Peace. In Pius' mind, it was to be a counterweight to the growing trend to deify the state as the ultimate source of both power and loyalty. This was most especially exemplified by the totalitarian governments of the time, especially the communists in Russia, the fascists in Italy and, later, the Nazis in Germany. The Church was reacting to systems of government that sought to place themselves, instead of God, in the hearts of their citizens. While all three may have gone away, the errors they propounded have stayed, taking other forms. If God can be pushed out of the human heart by the State, He can also be pushed out by ourselves, if not personally, then by the cultural mores of our times. If we call Jesus Christ King of the Universe then we recognize that somehow our faith touches us in the way we live in this world and it challenges us to look at our lives, our priorities, the ordering of our days and ask ourselves if those decisions we make actually reflect what we believe.

The remembrance of the whole environment of the creation of this Feast is a timely moment to ask ourselves how we have celebrated the Holy Year, 2025, the Year of Hope. It will be coming to a close on January 6, 2026. If there was ever a need for hope in our world, it is today. With so much destruction in our world, violence, warfare, division, hatred, poverty, hunger (and so many other attitudes and actions that debase human dignity) maybe we need to do what the good Sisters used to suggest years ago, to "storm heaven" with our prayers, for peace (100 years later and we still haven't found it), justice, and a new sense of **hope**. I have a suggestion. As my Advent activity (beginning a little early), I had intended to re-read **33 Days to Eucharistic Glory**. This past Saturday, I received an email from a parishioner who is currently reading it but may "re-read" it in days to come because he found it to be so powerful. Now, you know I am a great believer in *divine providence*, and so that was a clear call to invite everyone in the parish to (1) re-read it if you've already read it or (2) read it now if you have not. It's available on Amazon as an audiobook, a paperback or on your Kindle. I plan to start the Saturday of this weekend and end on Christmas Eve but you can start anytime although my suggestion would be to start so as to end no later than January 6, 2026, the end of the Year of Hope. Let's "storm heaven" for a HOPE that becomes a reality.

Thursday of this week is Thanksgiving Day. Even with all

the strife in our world, we have much to be thankful for. I invite you to join with fellow parishioners at the 8:30AM Mass to give thanks to God on Thursday morning for whatever you might know as gift in your lives. Bread will be blessed and distributed to take and share at your Thanksgiving table, uniting everyone present in one voice of thanks to our good and gracious God.

The great season of Hope, Advent, begins next weekend. More than a week ago I already started seeing homes decorated for Christmas. While I really love to see these “great creations,” as a reminder of the gift God gives of Himself in the birth of the Savior, I must admit it seems a little early to do it even before Thanksgiving. Be that as it may, Advent is right around the corner. The parish is offering a great opportunity to take a little time to reflect (in counterweight to—the holiday rush) on the meaning of Advent just as it begins so maybe the reflection can carry everyone through the rush of the remaining 3 weeks. It will be given on Monday night, Dec. 1 by Sarah Shutrop, a great inspirational speaker (ask any of the parents of students in our Religious Education/Formation program). More information can be found elsewhere in this bulletin. I plan to attend myself.

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE



TODAY'S READINGS

1. 2 Samuel 5:1-3

As this book begins, David enjoys many blessings from God. Already ruling as King of Judah since Saul's death, the tribes once ruled by Saul finally recognize that, although Saul held the title of King, David was their real king all along. These northern tribes now admit that God's hand was in David's successes and they identify their newfound bond with David, as their flesh and bone. David for his part will only accede to their wishes when it has been confirmed in the presence of the Lord. It is not popular demand that counts; it is evidence of God's choice.

2. Colossians 1:12-20

The false teachings which threaten the faith of the community of Colossae lead Paul to write, affirming the Risen Jesus as the center of salvation, even, in fact, the whole world. Today's excerpt contains the confessional hymn by which Paul sets forth the truth of his message: Christ is the image of God through Whom we can come to know God, He is the firstborn of humankind and of the dead, in Him, believers are offered a glimpse of what they too will be, as Word, He is above all celestial beings and bodies (the refutation of the particular false teaching), and He is head of the church which continues His work in the world.

3. Luke 23:35-43

Luke situates the kingship of Jesus in the narrative of the Cross. The political crime (a king in an empire where the only king was Caesar) betrays the reality, the scandal of the Messiah of God and King of the Jews is that He must be servant, enduring suffering and death to place Himself in that service to all humankind. And this victory/humiliation will divide people throughout the ages, as it divides the two criminals on either side, those who reject a kingship that includes service and those who accept it and follow in the same footsteps.

1. Have you ever experienced Christ leading you? How?
2. Has the Gospel helped you experience divine love?
3. Have your own sacrifices led someone else to God?
