Dear Friends,

Does anyone remember Dolores Hart? I asked this question in my homily last Sunday. To my surprise, a few hands went up. Dolores Hart was an American actress whose first movie role was opposite Elvis Presley in the 1957 movie, *Loving You*. She made ten films in five years, including the cult-like *Where the Boys Are*. While filming *Francis of Assisi* in Italy in 1960, she joined the film crew in an audience with Pope St. John XXIII. She introduced herself as “Dolores Hart, the actress playing Clare” (St. Clare), to which the Pope responded, “No, you are Clare.”

This started Dolores Hart on a road which eventually led to her leaving acting to enter the convent of a Benedictine Monastery in Bethlehem, Connecticut. where she still lives.

Metanoia. Life changing. That’s what Dolores Hart experienced from the brief encounter with the saintly John XXIII. In this Greek form, it is the word John the Baptist used to call people to a new way of life. Translated “repent,” in that text, it goes far deeper than repentance. It is a call to a new vision, a new way of looking at life. Perhaps these last years of Covid have opened your (and my) eyes to seeing life a little differently, with a new emphasis on relationships, the place of family and other values which, somehow, can get pushed aside in the hustle and bustle of life as we knew it, pre-pandemic.

If these thoughts have crossed your mind in these last almost three years, if you have come to see the passing nature of so many things that we thought were so important, and want to continue to re-arrange your priorities, include in that re-arrangement your relationship with God. Advent is a special time when our hearts are often touched by the gift of believing that God loves us too much He came to share life with us, and the reality of that fills us more with hope than at any other time of the year, especially as we seem to be moving further and further away from the experience of the darkest days of the pandemic. It is really a good time to put things right with God, a time to acknowledge how far we may have drifted away from Him in the course of our building a life that was so radically changed by the pandemic.

Let this Advent be the time to do that. Experience again the peace that comes from the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the sense of a new beginning, a fresh start, as we all have experienced in these last few months. For the first time in three years we will again celebrate a communal Penance Service, on Wednesday evening, Dec. 21st at 7:30 PM. It is a time to reflect on ourselves, where we have been and where we want to go, with the opportunity for individual confession. Six priests will be celebrating and hearing confession that evening. In addition, four priests will hear confessions on Saturday, Dec. 17th from 1PM-2PM and again on Monday evening, Dec. 19th from 7-8PM.

Daily events remind us how fragile life really is. They also remind us that there is no time like the present to make

those changes in our lives which will lead to greater fulfillment and deeper harmony and peace, within ourselves and with the world (and people) around us. God is really waiting for us, to extend the healing embrace of His love. Come, either Saturday, Monday or Wednesday. I know the Lord will not let you down.

Duties/Responsibilities

- Coordinates and ensures compliance with document retention policies

Mount Carmel's Homeless Retreat Ministry continues to spread Christ's Love through the Advent Season

The Ignatian Spirituality Project (ISP), also known as the Homeless Retreat Ministry at OLMC, offers experiences of hope, healing and belonging to women and men recovering from homelessness and addiction. By inviting participants into a deeper encounter with the God of their understanding, ISP Retreats and Spiritual programs provide the encouragement and empowerment necessary to make real, transformative life changes.

On the weekend of November 5-6, eleven women experienced an overnight ISP Retreat at St. Marguerite's Retreat House in Mendham, NJ. A Follow Up Spiritual Gathering took place at OLMC on Tuesday evening, November 29. The ISP women's retreat and Follow Up Spiritual Gathering were facilitated by Parishioners Rebecca Kingston, Suzanne Zilvetti, Maureen O'Connor Martin and Cathy Shea. Additionally, the ISP Women's Team offers Spiritual Reflections at the Social Service Agencies we partner with as well as monthly Spiritual Gatherings on Zoom for the ISP Women's Community.

The OLMC ISP Women's Team and ministry participants were invited to the Papermill Playhouse's Community Night on October 18th which was by invitation only and free of charge. This invitation resulted from the ISP Women's Team's partnership with the Papermill Playhouse led by parishioner Christy Kearney. A group of 27 former ISP retreatants, team members and supporters attended. Other performances are available to the ISP women's team at deeply discounted ticket prices. Invitations to cultural experiences like this, not typically available to these women, evidence our Christian belief in each individual's inherent human dignity. This partnership has been instrumental in building the ISP Community.

TODAY'S READINGS

1. Isaiah 35:1-6

The Book of Isaiah is a series of alternating oracles, of judgment and of healing. Without faith, the nations would suffer, but faith leads to restoration and life. Today's excerpt is an oracle of life and healing. Without faith, the land has been parched and without life. But when trust in God returns, the land bursts into life. As the people have been transformed, so too the land, bursting now with blooms and flowers, watered as if a garden, with the breathtaking views of the Lebanon range, the forested slopes of Carmel and the fertile plains of Sharon. The people, themselves, previously blind and deaf to the ways of God, now recognize God's plan for them, and His wisdom and care.

2. James 5:7-10

James reminds us that this process of transformation, as envisioned in Isaiah, is one in which healing, growth and wholeness come about only gradually. For that reason, patience, which is mentioned three times in this short excerpt, is the important watchword. The imagery of the farmer is employed to remind the reader of the reliability of God's promise—their patience is a virtue that originates in God, not in themselves. But that patience must also be exercised in relationship with one another, and with each other's failures and shortcomings.

3. Matthew 11:2-11

The Matthean John the Baptist has become confused about the identity of Jesus. At Jesus' baptism, John recognizes in Him the One Who would come after me. But now, in prison, he questions. Why? The message is not the one John expected. Not a fiery preacher of imminent judgment and the terror of the final end, Jesus instead has preached love and compassion and service of those who had formerly been considered outcasts. But He does not answer John's concerns directly. Instead, He draws attention to what can be seen and heard, healing and redemption. John has served his purpose but, even as the greatest prophet of the old age, he pales in comparison to the least in this new Kingdom.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Where are the "deserts" in your life? Do you find God in these places? How and where do you find closeness with God to help you through?
2. Where in your life do you need strengthening and how do you find it?
3. Who have been instruments of God's intervention in your life?
