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TODAY'S READINGS

1. Wisdom 18: 6-9

True wisdom comes from giving priority to a right relationship with God. People who gain such wisdom enjoy advantages in life not available to those who do not. Examples of this from the exodus account are drawn by the author in chapters 11 thru 19, from which today's excerpt comes, relating the story of the final plague in Egypt. Believing in God's promise as descendants of Abraham, they received "glory"

on the night of the Passover while their adversaries (the Egyptians) were punished for their resistance to God's word.

2. Hebrews 11: 1-2, 8-19

Faith is not just a series of truths but a trust in the fidelity of the Lord to his promises. Chapter 11 of Hebrews mentions many faith-heroes, the most prominent of which is Abraham. Abraham believed God would fulfill His word and so the author of Hebrews cites this authenticity of Abraham's faith and recommends his example to the reader for emulation. Abraham not only had faith in his heart, he outwardly reflected this faith in actions that cooperated with God's word, even to the point of sacrificing his son, Isaac.

3. Luke 12: 32-48

The first part of this passage serves as a transition from last week's Gospel about the foolishness of the man who centers his life on the material, and the anxiety that comes with it, to the theme of watchfulness. Since the end times could not be predicted, the good servant is one who is always watchful and thus prepared for the master's coming, whenever that might be. When this happens, the master will reverse roles, waiting on the servant who had been waiting on him. This watchfulness and fidelity most especially should be found in church leaders to whom much as been entrusted.

2. How would my life be different if I didn't have faith in God?
3. How would my life be different if I had a greater or even absolute faith in God?
